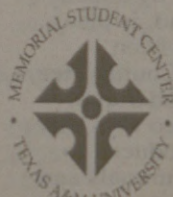

Texas, ranked third entering Saturday's game, tumbled seven spots to No. 10 in the AP media poll released Sunday, while Colorado shot up five spots to No. 5.

The Holiday and Rose bowls are both in California, but they couldn't be more distant in terms of importance.

"You start looking at what we had, we do not have it anymore," said Texas coach Mack Brown, who lost a chance to win his first conference championship in 18 years as a head coach.

Colorado (10-2) turned Simms' four first-half turnovers into 26 points. Simms threw three interceptions — one was returned for a touchdown — and fumbled on a sack to set up another Buffs score.

"We wanted to hit him (Simms), hit him and hit him again. Even if it was late, we wanted to hit him," said Colorado strong safety Michael Lewis.

"I was stunned with what happened to me individually," a teary-eyed Simms said afterward. "We

have a great team and we had a chance to go to Rose Bowl. I do not know what happened."

Texas eventually replaced Simms with Mack Brown, and the senior nearly rallied Texas to the win. But ultimately it was too little, too late.

The victory gave Colorado its first Big 12 title and the conference's automatic BCS berth.

"When we left the hotel today, I told them we are a team of destiny," said Colorado coach Bill McCartney. "No one is playing with more heart than we are now. Whoever we play next, they're going to get one heck of a football team."

Simms' pratfall will be most disappointing to Brown. The decision to start Simms over Steve Applewhite, the school's career passing leader, has been the most controversial aspect of Brown's four-year tenure.

Applewhite responded by throwing a 79-yard touchdown to B.J. Johnson on his second pass, but the Colorado lead to 29-17. His TD pass to Johnson with 31 seconds left made it 39-17.

It is sure to spark more questions about whether to start Texas' bowl game.

tion in the second set as the Longhorns closed to within two points on a hitting error by Cole. The Aggies pulled away with another run as Moscovice highlighted an 8-2 run with three kills that pushed the Aggies' lead to 20-12.

The Longhorns answered with a 9-4 run of their own, sparked by three kills by Katia Lara to close the gap to 24-21.

A&M then pulled away, scoring six of the last seven points of the game to win, 30-22.

In the third game, the Longhorns led for the first part of the game, opening a 15-13 lead on kills by Howden and Mira Topic.

As she did before, Achilefu

sparked the Aggies as he hit three kills and a block helped Aggies to a 7-0 run for the lead at 20-12.

The Aggies finished the match and advanced to the Sweet 16 when an attack by Howden fell into the net, giving the Aggies the third final game.

Cole led the Aggies with 10 kills and nine digs. A&M's outside hitter Erin Lechler and freshman middle blocker Mike Munsch both had double-doubles with Munsch notching 11 kills and 10 digs and Lechler adding 10 kills and 10 digs.

The Longhorns were led by Mira Topic, who had 17 kills and 10 digs, and Howden, who had 11.

The No. 11 Aggies will play the No. 6 Wisconsin Badgers in the Sweet 16.

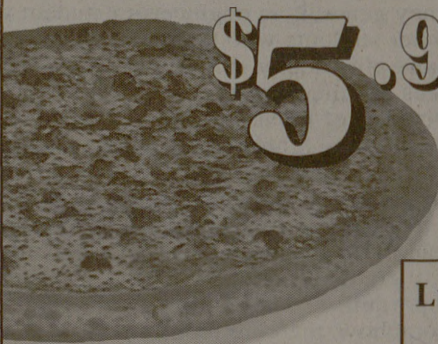

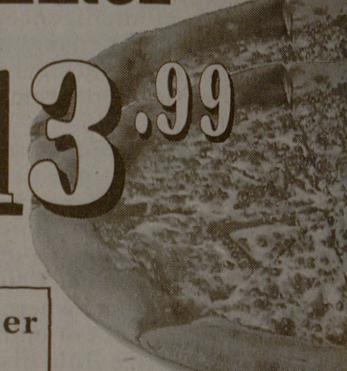
