Cheney and a radical improvement on old wheelchair design. Kamen said the battery-powered scooter requires little electricity. His Manchester, N.H.-based firm, DEKA Research and Development, will oversee production of the machine.

The two-wheeled Segway, which looks like a cross between an old rotary lawn mower and a modern scooter, travels at a top speed of 17 mph. Built-in gyroscopes are designed to keep it from falling over.

Riders stand upright over the invention's single axle, navigating with a bicycle-like handlebar. A single battery charge can propel the scooter 17 miles on level ground, and each hour of charging provides enough power for two hours' use, Kamen said.

The U.S. Postal Service's General Electric and National Parks Service will be the first buyers, purchasing 80-piece heavy-duty models for \$8,000 apiece, according to Time. A 65-pound, \$3,000 consumer model will not be available for at least a year.

Kamen was scheduled to unveil the scooter on ABC's Good Morning America on Monday. ABC's parent company, The Walt Disney Co., has sponsored Kamen's robot-building competitions for students.

Plans for the device were revealed on the Web site Inside.com almost a year ago, leading to speculation about what it was and would do. It is code-named "Ginger" or "T1."

Time said its article's author was allowed to shadow Kamen for three months, on condition of secrecy. Other publications, including the *New York Times*, were given advance information on the project in return for pledges to secrecy.

The Associated Press also offered an advance look at the invention under certain conditions, but turned down the offer.

ed litters of transgenically-cloned piglets.

"Today we are making good solid progress in our research, but we don't have enough to announce anything new at this point," Piedrahita said.

Piedrahita and fellow researchers are continuing to conduct cloning experiments,

following up on the progress of the cloned animals and developing new clones with ongoing pregnancies.

"We are currently studying the behavior and physical characteristics of the clones that were created," he said.

Funding for Piedrahita's research is from both public and private sources.

"The majority, about 70 percent, comes from the federal

government," Piedrahita said. "We also receive 20 percent from the state government and 10 percent from private industries."

A&M has strongly encouraged cloning research, Piedrahita said.

"We receive a large amount of support from the University, from the infrastructure facilities to general support," Piedrahita said. "It's a great place to do this work."

making sure our children are immunized and asking that we have a mayor who stands up and defends the city when it's being attacked," Sanchez said, referring to the Democratic assault on Houston during the 2000 presidential race.

Sanchez, vying to become Houston's first Hispanic mayor, lost to the city's first black mayor. The general election, in which Sanchez and

Brown beat white non-Hispanic city council member Chris Bell, stayed away from race and ethnicity. They became issues in the runoff, with one pro-Brown ad claiming Sanchez was an "imitation Caucasian" for claiming "white" as his race on his driver's license.

However, in Texas "Hispanic" is not a race. All Hispanics must choose white, black, Asian, American Indian or other.

Brown said the ad, which ran on at least one black-oriented radio station, was not his.
