Worley told The Bryan-College Station Eagle on Jan. 10 that he opposes any involvement of Planned Parenthood in Bryan Schools.

"I think we should definitely exclude Planned Parenthood or anybody else who has, as a part of their business, [a service] which does not fit into the curriculum," Worley said,

Smith maintains, however, that the cancellation was an effort to save the financially strained district from the \$3,000 cost of the fair. The decision that the fair be cancelled was not announced at the December meeting because it was not slated in the agenda, Smith said.

"The administration did make the decision after last fall to not continue the Wellness Fair in its current format," Smith said.
