"With our research we want to see what other genes, any, are affected by this," Finnell said. "Not every baby and baby will benefit from treatments."

The second research is in Nebraska, under the direction of Dr. Thomas Rosenquist, who studies chicken embryos as a mental model.

The California Birth Defects Monitoring Program will study congenital heart defects in babies and their relationships to genetics and to the behavior of mothers.

"We will be looking at the quantity of nutrients in the mother's diet, specifically acid and other vitamins," Gary Shaw, epidemiologist with the Birth Defects Monitoring Program. "So far, we have attributed some understanding of how folic acid will help prevent defects. We will also be looking for new mechanisms to help prevent defects as well."

Shaw's team will conduct DNA research to determine if genetics plays a role in defects.

The National Institutes of Health's grant will last for five years. Funding began in July.

"By the end of our project, we hope to be able to bring a whole new understanding of the causes of these heart defects, and this will significantly increase our ability to prevent them," Finnell said.

The costs of medical procedures and technology for newborns' heart defects exceed \$2.2 billion annually, and inpatient surgery alone accounts for \$1.1 billion, when the System Health Science Center is included.

The American Heart Association reports that one of every 1,000 infants are born with a heart defect. These children will be born with a heart defect, surgery after birth and advancement of medical technology, Finnell said, their hearts are able to work properly.
