#### Warlords may need U.S. advisers

KABUL, Afghanistan (AP) -Worried that renegade warlords could plunge Afghanistan into civil war once again, the United States may send military advisers to act as referees between rival factions, the U.S. special envoy said Sunday.

The idea appeared aimed at finding a way to stem factional fighting without expanding the U.S. military presence or diverting troops from hunting Taliban and al-Qaida fugitives.

"We are worried about the multiple armies," envoy Zalmay Khalilzad told reporters. "There is a danger of multiple armies going to war.

# California appeals for federal A 8 changes to electricity contract

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — California will petition the federal government to modify dozens of long-term electricity contracts signed during the peak of the state's power crisis, state officials

With California \$14.5 billion in the red, two state agencies will ask the federal government Monday to find that power sellers overcharged the state by roughly \$21 billion on contracts signed last spring to keep electricity flowing over the next

The appeal to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, which oversees wholesale electricity sales, could give the state leverage in its efforts to renegotiate contracts with the companies.

It could also lower electric bills, which would boost Gov. Gray Davis' approval ratings as he

seeks a second term in November. At issue are deals with 22 power fransportation including subsidiaries of Mirant Da Texas Ad

The state has pledged more than \$40% udge the d the contracts, which consumer groups perfore it is p utilities commissioners alike have call axpayers pa priced and unfair to ratepayers.
