



Continued from page 1A drying; both are alternatives to the common method of frying and yield a healthier, higher quality product.

Higher quality fried foods have a nice color and texture, a lower oil content and less destruction of the food's naturally occurring vitamins. Frying at higher temperatures creates more oil absorption and greater vitamin loss, resulting in a less healthy product, Moreira said.

"Once you understand the frying process, you can create a better product," she said.
