the issue of first amendment rights," Sarandis said. "We are a student organization, no one is running for an official government position."

The leaflet in question contains the text "Who's your daddy? Me. And I make damn cool T-shirts. Pimpin' for the best damn class ... fightin' Texas Aggie Class of 2004."

Sarandis said words such as "damn" and "hell" are inappropriate, and that the trademark Aggie yell "beat the hell outta ..." would be censored from campaign materials.

Dubberly said he spent about

\$30 on the leaflets, and could not ment is an independent st afford to print another batch.

"This may cost me the election, but we really need to set this right," Dubberly said.

All campaign materials, including flyers, posters, and even gimmicks such as handing out mints or pencils, must be approved by the election commissioner, Sarandis said. Candidates are advised not to buy campaign materials before they have been approved, Sarandis said, because als will count against candidates' spending limits.

Sarandis defended the commission's censorship authority, and said because student govern-
