# A&M swimmers finish 21st at NCAA's, UT claims title

The Texas A&M men's swimming and diving team closed out its 2001-02 season Saturday night with a 21st place finish at the NCAA Championships held in Gabrielsen Natatorium on the campus of the University of Georgia.

Texas, who entered the meet ranked third nationally, topped No. 1 Stanford by a score of 512 to 501 for its third straight, and 10th overall, national title.

A&M scored all eight of its points on Saturday by virtue of a fifth-place finish in the consolation final of the 400-yard freestyle relay. The foursome of Patrick Kennedy, Matt Rose,

Robbie Taylor and Dan Blanchard took 13th overall after swimming a time of 2:57.09. The quartet swam 2:56.95, the 13th fastest time in the preliminaries, in order to qualify for the final.

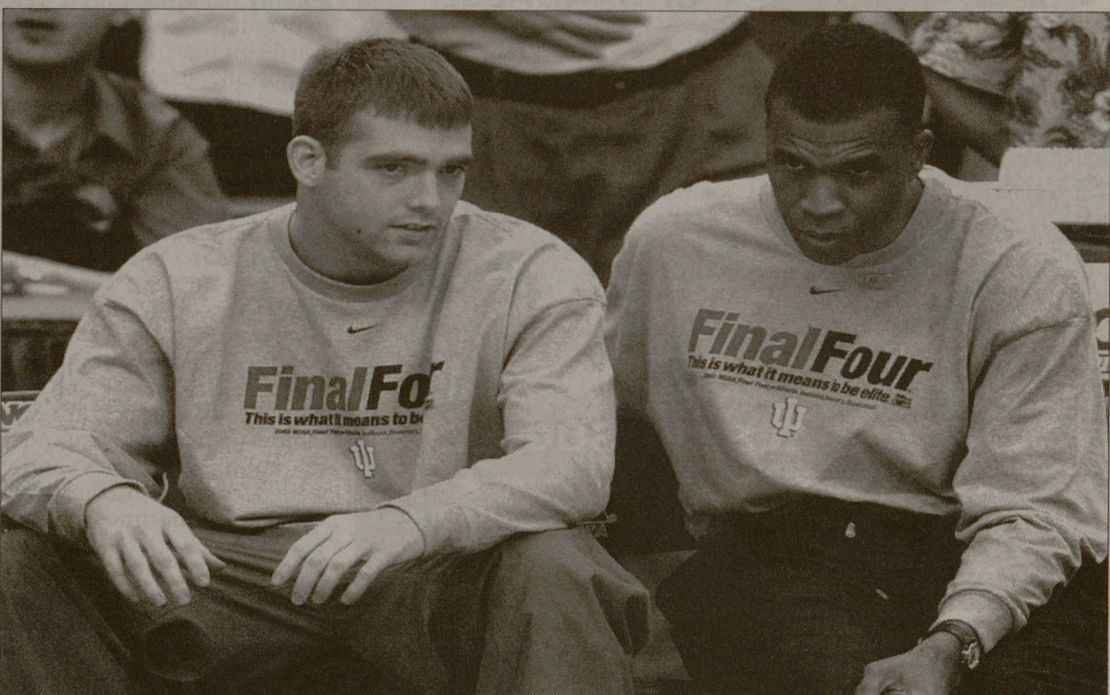
Kennedy, swimming the last meet of his collegiate career, just missed qualifying for the final in the 200 backstroke after swimming a seasonal-best time of 1:44.94. Kennedy was the first swimmer not taken to Saturday's finals, missing the opportunity by just six-hundredths of a second.

Senior All-American diver Jesse Even finished 21st in the platform diving competition after being in the hunt for most of the in the finals for most of

the first half of the preliminaries. Even ranked between seventh and ninth place for each of the first four rounds before suffering a score of 9.45 on his fifth dive which dropped him all the way to 17th. A score of 36.45 on his sixth dive dropped him to 21st place where he remained for the majority of the rest of the prelims.

Sophomore All-American Matt Rose just missed qualifying for finals after finishing 21st in the morning preliminaries of the 100 freestyle in 43.85.

Freshman Alfredo Jacobo claimed 30th in the 200 breaststroke in the morning preliminaries. Jacobo neared his personal best of 2:00.98 by finishing in 2:01.08.

15-for-19 they had from beyond the arc in the regional final win over Kent State.

To win the last game the Hoosiers will need that 3-point shooting and solid inside play from Jared Jeffries and Jarrod Odle to offset the formidable Maryland front line of Lonny Baxter, Chris Wilcox and Byron Mouton.

"Any team that's gotten to where Indiana has gotten, you don't look at their record, you look at

how they're playing now," Williams said. "Any time a team plays team defense like they do, they have a chance to beat anybody."

The list of anybody includes Duke. Indiana pulled off a stunning upset and ruined most pool bracket sheets, beating the Blue Devils 74-73 in the regional semifinals.

Maryland (31-4) didn't surprise anybody with its wins. All-American Juan Dixon was his usual self in each, adding to his tournament run with 33 points in the 97-88 win over fellow top seed Kansas on Saturday night. The Terrapins held on after losing most of a 20-point lead over the final six minutes.

However, Garland shut the door on Newport on court No. 1 to clinch the victory.

"I felt like I played pretty well in the second set,"
