Prosecutors say he confessed to the crime in the late 1970s while attending Elan School, a substance abuse facility in Poland Spring, Maine. Gregory Coleman testified

last year that Skakel told him, "I'm gonna get away with murder. I'm a Kennedy" when the two attended Elan.

But Coleman, 39, later admitted he had injected heroin just before testifying. He has since died, one of many challenges for prosecutors facing fading memories, reluctant witnesses and credibility issues.
