



WASHINGTON (AP) - In an effort to clear consumer confusion, federal regulators forbid makers of certain flavored malt be ages from labeling and advertising them containing vodka, rum or other liquor.

The action by the Treasury Department Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Monday is aimed at the fast-growing ma for "malternative" drinks. Like beer, th products have a malt base, but they are u ally clear and flavored.

ATF spokesperson Jim Crandall said M Brewing Co.'s Skyy Blue and Bacardi Silver examples of products that would need to char their labeling to comply. He said Smirnoff another flavored malt beverage, would not affected because its labels do not suggest the drink contains liquor.
