Gonzalez out of Rangers lineup with hand injury

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — Juan Gonzalez was not in the Texas lineup Wednesday night against Oakland and was to see a specialist about his injured right hand.

After taking some swings in the batting cage before the game, Gonzalez pointed to his right thumb and traced a line along the muscle there when asked what the problem was.

The Rangers call it a deep bruise, and Gonzalez said he did not expect to go on the disabled list.

Rangers spokesperson John Blake said Gonzalez was scheduled to see a hand specialist Wednesday night. Blake did not know when the team would have results from that exam.

After Gonzalez came out of Tuesday's game, he was taken to

Arlington Memorial Hospital for X-rays, which were negative. Gonzalez left the game against the Athletics after two innings. He reaggravated the injury during his only at-bat, an infield popout.

Five days earlier, the two-time AL MVP left a game at Oakland in the ninth inning.

Gonzalez said he initially sustained the injury when he got jammed on a pitch last week in Oakland.

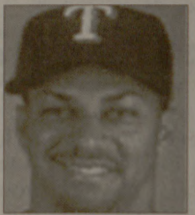
He said the pain worsened after several more at-bats, including Tuesday against Barry Zito.

Through seven games return to Texas, Gonzalez is hitting .250 (6-for-24) with two homers and no RBIs.

With Gonzalez out, second baseman Michael Young back home in California. The death of a family member has two everyday players on the bench — catcher Haselman and infielder Perry. Rookie Kevin Millar replaced Gonzalez in right field.

Gonzalez signed a \$3 million, two-year contract with the offseason to return to Texas, where he played from 1989 to 1999.

He was traded to Cleveland after the 1999 season, where he spent one year with the Indians before moving on to Cleveland for one season.

Zeile leads Rockies over Astros

DENVER (AP) — Todd Zeile homered for the third straight game, and Shawn Chacon allowed one earned run in 6 1-3 innings Wednesday to lead the Colorado Rockies over the Houston Astros 4-1.

Chacon (1-1) gave up five hits, struck out five and hit two batters.

Zeile hit a two-run homer in the eighth inning.

Larry Walker had two hits, including his homer of the season, and drove in two runs. Dave Mlicki (0-2) allowed two earned runs in eight hits in six innings.

Chacon didn't allow a runner past second base until Richard Hidalgo led off the seventh with a homer.

Hidalgo's second homer of the season led the Astros to 2-1.

Baylor is hoping for a Big 12 title as well, but its chances were dashed with a loss to the Aggies on Thursday.

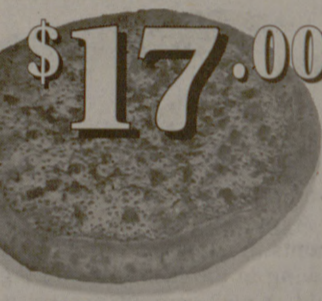
"It's going to be a tough match," Kleinecke said. "It's probably come down to a point difference, and who wants it the most and is willing to stay out there the longest to come away with the win."

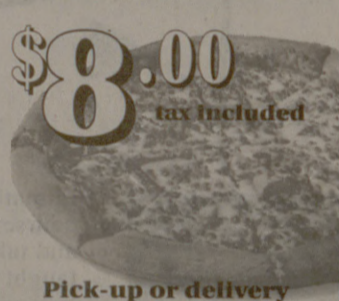
