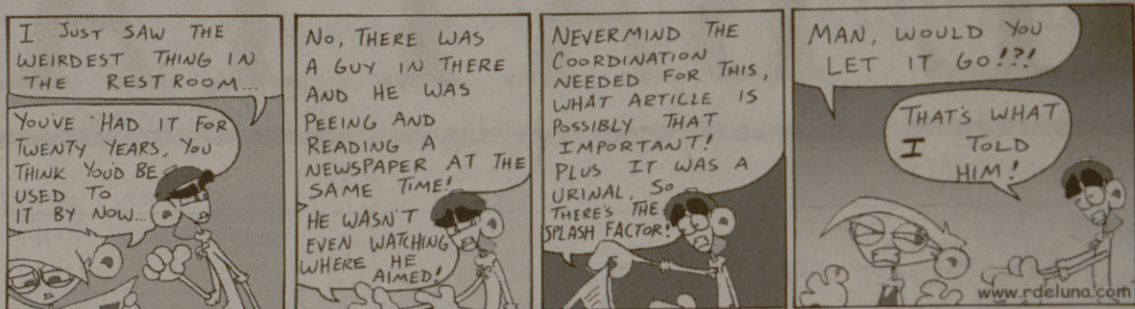

to residency programs, available positions at teaching hospitals.

"The match program provides a uniform date for medical students to be accepted into a residency program," Dr. Kathleen Fallon, associate dean of student affairs, admissions. "The program to optimize the student's choice for a residency program of the residency program's choice for next year's positions."

Graduate students turn their lists of top choice residency into the NRMP, the program then provides the highest match for the student.

Matt and Kathryn Miller, Class of 2002 College of Medicine graduates, applied residency through the National Residency Matching Program. They were placed in a combined internal medicine and pediatrics at Kaiser Permanente in San Francisco.

"It was a blessing to be placed in our top-choice residency," said Matt Miller. "The medical school and residency training locations will be a great experience here at Texas A&M and we look forward to our experiences at Vanderbilt."

Compared to other universities, A&M has done well in matching program, Fallon said. Most schools do not match 100 percent of their students to residency programs.

More than 96 percent of graduates for the year 2001 were matched successfully in residency programs; in the year 2000, all of the graduates were matched, Fallon said.

"Nationally, the average runs 93 to 94 percent of graduate medical students receiving a position for the first year," said Fallon. "Sixty-seven percent of national graduates are unmatched."

Graduates for 2002 will be placed in primary care specialties, including family medicine, internal medicine, pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology.

Twenty-three College of Medicine graduates were placed in Texas hospital residency programs, while others graduates will go as far west as Washington and California and as far east as New York and South Carolina.

Nineteen other states will hold residency positions. "What the College of Medicine is calling 'Aggie Docs'."

"I am so limited academically in what I get to do that I see this as a chance to learn a little about other cultures," she said. "I think this event will not only promote unity and diversity, but it's a demonstra-

tion of the friendliness this campus is known for."

Approximately 400 people attended the first Whoopstock in 1993, Benson said.
