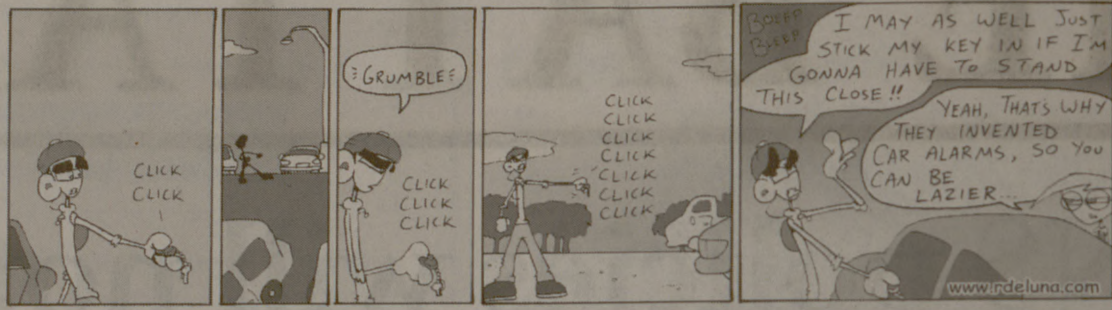

but not out of, the affected area.
"If bee keepers do have Africanized bees in their hives, the quarantine prevents them from spreading," Baxter said.
Baxter said the state is working with bee keepers, stressing cleanliness and control of hives, to prevent the spread of Africanized honeybees.

"The more good, gentle honeybees we have, the less room there is for the Africanized bees," Baxter said.
People also can take extra precautions to protect themselves from the bees by knowing where they commonly like to nest, Baxter said.
"People need to be aware of what's in their yards," Baxter said. "Bees will get into strange places."
According to the AgNews Website, those places can include holes or cracks in build-

ing walls and trees, underneath mobile homes, meter boxes, flower pots, old barns or sheds, underneath picnic tables in park shelters.
If stung by a bee, one should remove the stinger quickly, use an ice pack or stinging ointment to reduce swelling and pain and seek medical attention if an allergic reaction occurs.
