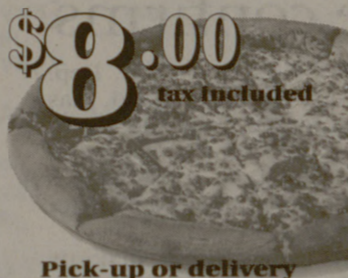

At least 14 killed in bombing in southern Philippines

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — Three explosions ripped through a major city in the southern Philippines on Sunday, killing at least 14 people and injuring 45 others after a radio-station caller warned of a wave of bombings.

The caller claimed to be from the Muslim extremist group Abu Sayyaf, which has been holding an American missionary couple for nearly 11 months and is the target of a U.S.-backed military campaign as part of Washington's war on terrorism.

One bomb exploded outside a busy department store in downtown General Santos, killing at least 14 people — four of them children — in a hail of shrapnel and flying glass. Within 40 minutes, bombs went off near a radio station and a bus terminal in the largely Christian city of 800,000 in the Mindanao region, where Islamic militants have been fighting for an independent homeland.

The scene of blood, wreckage and shattered glass was reminiscent of five nearly simultaneous bombings in Manila 16 months ago that killed 22 people. An Indonesian man who has claimed he planned those blasts pleaded guilty Thursday in General Santos to explosives possession after leading police to a buried cache of more than a ton of TNT, detonating cords and M-16 rifles.

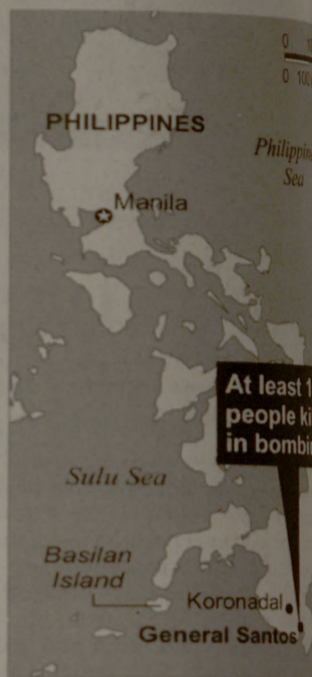
Police said it was too early to accuse any specific group of carrying out Sunday's bombings, blaming only "terrorists."

But a Radio Mindanao Network office in nearby Koronadal said it received a call an hour before the first blast from a man who earlier called to complain about police boasts that the city was safe from terrorists. The man asked whether the station wanted to cover bombings later in the day.

A separate warning circulated via cellphone text message — a chief method of communications in the Philippines — said 18 bombs had been planted around the city and would start exploding after lunch.

Police said they received an anonymous call with the same claim, but did not say what measures were taken. Bomb threats are common in the Philippines.

Radio station manager Elmer Ubaldo said he decided not to air the warning because he did not want to cause panic. The caller identified himself as Abu Muslim al-Ghazie and said he represented Harakatul al-Islamiyah, the formal name used by Abu Sayyaf. Other spokespersons for the group said they had no knowledge of Abu Sayyaf involvement.

Far-right leader pulls upset in France, will face Chirac in runoff

PARIS (AP) — In a huge upset, extreme-right leader Jean-Marie Le Pen qualified on Sunday to face President Jacques Chirac in the runoff for French president, according to media projections based on exit polls.

Le Pen, who virulently opposes immigration, was projected to place second by all three major French networks, beating Prime Minister Lionel Jospin, who was in third place.

The projected result was seen as a political earthquake. For months, polls had consistently projected that Chirac, a conservative, and Jospin, a Socialist, would be the top two finishers in Sunday's first round of voting.

A shocked Jospin announced he would retire from political life immediately after the presidential election, which ends with the May 5 runoff.

Sunday's first-round of voting featured a record 16 candidates and an abstention rate estimated at 28 percent — the highest in nearly four decades.

Le Pen is founder and head of the National Front party, which historically has blamed immigrants for high unemployment and urban violence. He is notorious for once describing the Holocaust as "a detail" of history. He has denied he is anti-Semitic.

Le Pen, 73, has played a central role as kingmaker in past

presidential elections, with a typical score of 15 percent. He placed third in the last two runs. This is his fourth presidential campaign.

During the campaign, Chirac denied allegations that he had personally with Le Pen between the two rounds of the 1989 presidential election.

France has been governed since 1981 by Chirac's main stream right or the Socialists of the left. Centrists held power in previous terms.

For Jospin, a political heir of the late Socialist President Francois Mitterrand who had served as prime minister since 1997, it was a crushing blow.
