The Texas A&M baseball team looks to snap a three-game losing streak when the Aggies host Missouri in a weekend set at Olsen Field. After finishing regulation tied, 115-115, the two went to a one-arrow shoot off, archery's equivalent of having fourth-andgoal from the 2-yard line with one second on the clock.

Shooting at a distance of 20 yards, Zorn went first.

"The whole meet came down to one arrow," Zorn said. "It was either do or die, and you have 40 seconds. Outwardly, I wasn't very nervous, but I was having a pretty hard time functioning."

With the 40-second clock ticking down, Zorn pulled back but had trouble staying steady.

"I pulled back and held it, but it wasn't going to go in the middle at all. So I had to let down." By letting her bow down

By letting her bow down, Zorn had to start her shot all over again, all while the clock kept ticking. With 17 seconds left she pulled her bow back again.

Unlike a basketball player shooting a free throw, archers shooting at a target aim for several second before firing. By letting down from her initial draw, Zorn was forced to rush through her shooting routine.

From her position at full draw, she could not see the clock counting down, but the crowd behind her let her know how much time she had left, rhythmically following the countdown.

Agudo barely missed matching Zorn, firing a nine-point shot with her arrow and giving Zorn the individual indoor world championship.
