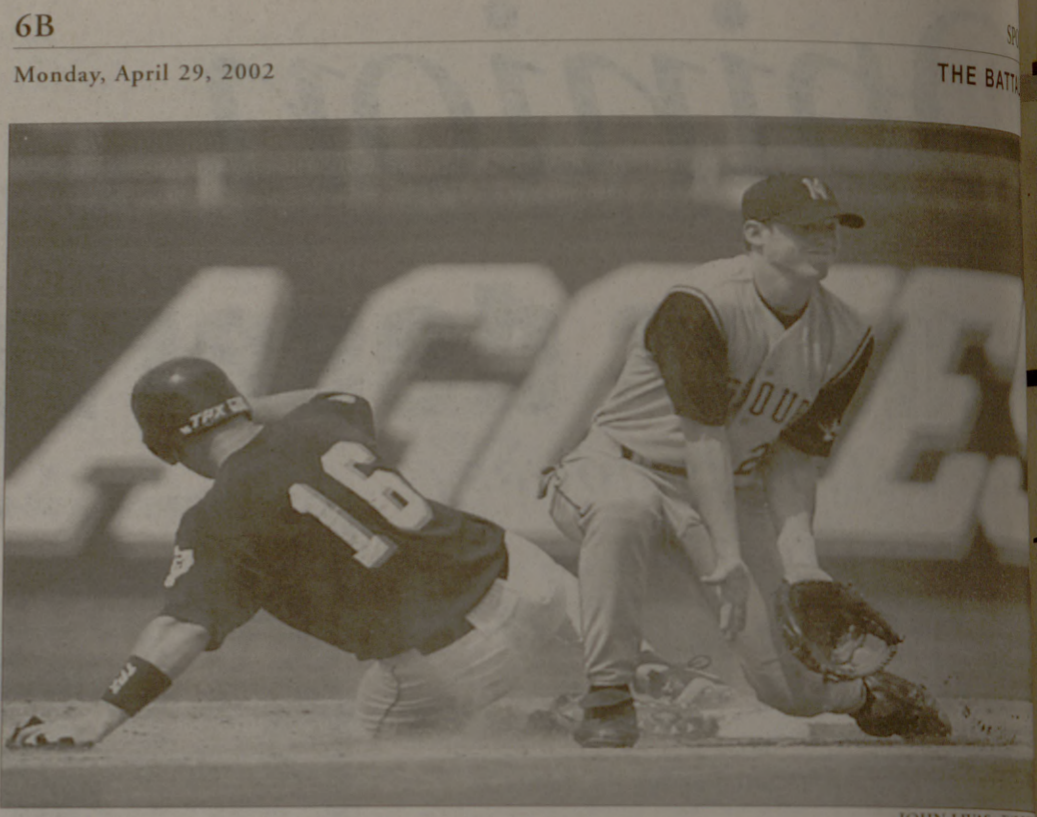

A&M drops two to Mizzou

How far the mighty have fallen.

A week removed from being in a tie for first place in the Big 12, the Texas A&M baseball team continued its fall from grace as the Missouri Tigers rolled over the Aggies to take the series at Olsen Field this weekend.

Despite losing two of three to Missouri, the Aggies managed to gain a spot in the Big 12 standings, moving from sixth to fifth, thanks to Oklahoma and Oklahoma State getting swept this weekend.

However, the jump in the standings was not at all indicative of how the Aggies performed this weekend.

Two things A&M has relied on during its recent hitting drought, pitching and good defense, were non-existent against Missouri.

The Aggies (32-18, 11-10 Big 12) committed 11 errors in the three games, which affected the pitching, as A&M gave up 29 runs.

"I don't know why this weekend jumped on us as bad as it did," said A&M head coach Mark Johnson. "We had guys make errors that hadn't made them in a long time. We looked like we hadn't played in a while. It's disappointing. I hate that it happened during the stretch run, but we didn't play well enough to deserve to win the series."

Saturday's doubleheader was a great example of what an enigma the Aggies have been lately.

After a six-run ninth inning fell short on Friday night as the Aggies lost, 11-10, they carried that momentum over into game one.

A&M scored 16 runs on 16 hits as it run-ruled the Tigers 16-5. Ty Garner led the A&M

attack, going 4-for-4, with home runs and six RBIs.

Instead of carrying solid performance into game two, the Aggies laid an egg. Missouri scored seven runs the first inning and looked back, returning favor by run-ruling the Aggies 13-2 in eight innings.

The last time A&M was ruled at Olsen Field was when the Longhorns defeated the Aggies, 18-6.

A&M starter Ryan Warren did not make it out of the first inning, pitching only one out of an inning.

He gave up six runs, two of which were earned, on two hits.

The Aggie defense suffered a meltdown as it recorded errors, three of which came from shortstop Matt Alexander, who came into the weekend with only six errors the season, totaled six errors the three games against Missouri.


