

Bush favors equitable mental health coverage for all

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) — President Bush threw his weight Monday behind the idea — if not the details — of legislation guaranteeing equitable insurance coverage for mental health services.

The president also gave his support to the California gubernatorial candidate he tried to defeat a month ago.

Turning to domestic policy and politics after a frenzied week-end of Mideast diplomacy, Bush traveled from his Texas ranch to the University of New Mexico here, and on to Los Angeles.

At each stop, he had his eye on the November elections that will decide control of Congress and sought both to raise millions of dollars for GOP candidates and also neuter Democrat attempts to paint him as a big-business, favor-the-rich Republican.

"We must work for a welcoming and compassionate society, a society where no American is dismissed and no American is forgotten," Bush said in an Albuquerque speech decrying the stigma and "hidden suffering" associated with mental disease.

Near the site of the 1992

south central Los Angeles riot, Bush was marking the anniversary of that violence by touting his administration's initiative to involve more groups in providing mental health services.


And on Tuesday, he gave a philosophical address to California's Silicon Valley, reprising his 2000 campaign theme, "a different kind of Republican."

Both California and New Mexico included fund-raising events in all — for Bill Clinton challenger to Democrat Gray Davis and the conservative Republican the House tried to knock out. GOP primary by favoring supporting former Los Angeles Mayor Richard Riordan.

Some White House advisers privately questioned the wisdom of spending presidential time helping Simon, who lost Davis by 14 percentage points in a Field Poll released Sunday.


In New Mexico, Bush he would try to broker a promise this year to become champions of mental health insurance "parity" between Republican and business opponents who fear that the government mandate policies cover mental disease the same way they cover physical illness.
