Brown elected to NBA Hall of Fame

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Philadelphia 76ers coach Larry Brown was elected to the Basketball Hall of Fame on Wednesday.

The Hall of Fame announced Brown's election in Los Angeles before the start of Game 1 of the NBA Finals.

The 61-year-old Brown has won more than 1,200 games in 30 seasons, including the American Basketball Association and college. He won an NCAA title at Kansas in 1988 and led the Sixers to the Finals last season after winning coach of the year honors for the first time in his NBA career.

Brown, a finalist for the nomination last year, got the required 18 of 24 votes from the Honors Committee this year.

Brown completed his fifth season with the Sixers last month, his longest tenure with any team in 19 years in the NBA. He coached five seasons at Kansas from 1983-1988, before leaving for San Antonio.

A consummate teacher who preaches defense, Brown has posted a winning record in 26 of his 30 seasons. His record in the NBA is 831-651. He was 229-107 in the ABA, and 177-61 in college. The Sixers are 207-171

under Brown, and have the playoffs four straight after a seven-year absence.

Over the past two seasons, Brown has hinted at several times. But the Sixers were eliminated by Boston Celtics in the round of the playoffs, said he plans to return to coaching on his contract, worth about \$6.25 million plus stock options.

Brown began his coaching career in 1972 with the Denver Nuggets, then moved to the Nets to a 20-win improvement in his first season and the Nets in both of his years there.

He went to Kansas in 1976, won the national title in 1988, then left for San Antonio in 1988. He coached the Spurs, then Los Angeles to coach the Clippers for one and a half seasons, then coached Indiana in 1997, before coming to Philadelphia in 1997.

Brown's biggest claim to fame probably has been coaching Sixers star Allen Iverson, who has had a tumultuous career since he arrived in Philadelphia.

The Hall of Fame ceremony takes place on Sept. 10 in Springfield, Mass.

the game in ever-increasing numbers. Their parents still won't watch it on TV. Yet another plan to close the gap on the rest of the world will be proposed, but the debate won't be loud or last very long after the last ball has been kicked at this World Cup.

That is both a blessing and a curse. It has bought the U.S. effort time — to benefit from the development of a league of our own, to benefit from the opportunities abroad afforded a few Americans playing in the top European leagues, time to scout, nurture and forge emerging talent into a cohesive unit.

But that lack of urgency is why U.S. coach Bruce Arena sounds conflicted much of the time. He is astute enough to know the impressive strides the U.S. program has made in the past dozen years. But he also knows better than anybody else how much further there is to go.

That is why one minute, Arena will complain about a lack of support, "The magnitude of this event is not understood by the American public." Then, quickly, he will catch himself and say, "If I say anything, it sounds like sour grapes."

Arena understands what few of his countrymen do. This team is better — better prepared, better coached, tougher, faster, more skillful, experienced and committed — than any team the United States has fielded. But it will still need luck to enlarge the small dent it just registered in America's sporting consciousness.

Being a heavy underdog against Portugal was one thing. Catching a South Korean team on the rebound from an emotional first win over Poland and stoked by a chanting, flag-waving hometown crowd is going to be another.

The Americans arrived at the

finals without a win in the five World Cup games and from their own experience in 1994 that no host team has ever won the second round.

Now, Poland, already surpassed once by the Koreans, will be in no better a position than the United States.

None of this is surprising. Arena knows the following home won't be interested in subtleties of how this team adapts in ways that the U.S. could not, how it has been injured by injuries that the team escaped.

He lost Chris Armas, a defensive midfielder who advanced his one world-class player's knee surgery just before the tournament. Clint Mathis, his best scorer, and Clarence Reyna, his best passer, will be fighting nagging injuries for as long as the United States hangs around.

Neither made an appearance against Portugal. Arena covers their absence by trotting Landon Donovan and DaMarcus Beasley, a pair of 20-year-olds from Major League Soccer, and burning his more experienced and more skilled rival work once.

"Would we like to have Armas here?" Arena said. "Not going to happen."

He then listed all the missing from the all-time world-class contenders.

"It's not just the U.S. team," Arena concluded.

No, but it is the fans of U.S. team who will look in on tournament now and not know who was missing. They will want to know whether their team will be around at the end.

It may not be fair, but now, that's the way it is going to be.

name with a Minute Maid emblem on its side.

"This is as exciting as a Jeff Bagwell home run," McLane said. It gives baseball a second park with a juice company sponsor. The Tampa Bay Devil Rays play in Tropicana Field, sponsored by Florida-based Tropicana Products Inc., a division of Coca-Cola rival PepsiCo.

Tropicana is the nation's largest juice maker; Minute Maid No. 2. Minute Maid also makes other drinks.

"We felt it was time to raise the visibility of Minute Maid in our own hometown," said Don Knauss, president and CEO of Minute Maid of North America.

The contract includes naming rights for the stadium, continuing rights to sell Minute Maid juices at the ballpark and the Minute Maid Squeeze Play, a play area for children, that already was in place.
