Astros ready park with orange flavor

HOUSTON (AP) — Oranges are now fashionable at the Houston Astros' newly named ballpark. Workers spent last weekend starting to plaster the new Minute Maid Park — on banners and signs throughout the 3-year stadium. Since the start of this season, it had been called Astros Field. Team owner Drayton McLane worked to find a new naming partner following the demise of Houston-based Enron Corp. The bankrupt energy trader's name had been on everything: staff uniforms to cups, napkins, plates and tickets sold before the of the 2002 season. Fans attending Houston's Monday night game against the Chicago Cubs were first to see the initial results of the name change announced last week when the Astros were out of town. "Fans will be able to tell this is Minute Maid Park," Astros president of engineering Bert Pope said of the dozens of logos placed throughout the park. Signs designating various sections at the retractable roof include oranges designed to look like baseballs. The top of the dugout also has new greeting: "Welcome to Minute Maid Park." The team's proposed logo includes its new name in white orange lettering atop a black baseball diamond. A large orange lettered with seams like a baseball, sits atop the Minute Maid name on second base would be on its diamond background. Green, yellow, blue trace the letters of the baseball field's new name in the logo, includes a green leaf sprouting from the top of the orange. Three months ago, the Astros removed the last vestiges of Enron name from of the park after buying the bankrupt energy giant for its 30-year, \$100 million naming rights contract. The Astros paid \$2.1 million to get out of the deal.

 States and Costa Rica at 1-0-1, Mexico at 2-0. Also striving for the second round on Tuesday were defending champion France, Senegal, Denmark and Uruguay in Group A; Germany, Cameroon and Ireland in Group E. France needed to beat Denmark by two goals or become the first defending champion since Brazil in 1966 not to get out of the opening round. Senegal needed only a tie against Uruguay, which had only a small chance of advancing. Germany would move on if it tied or beat Cameroon, which could clinch a second-round berth with a win or an Ireland loss to already-eliminated Saudi Arabia. Ireland needed a two-goal victory to move on. Violence in Moscow after Japan's victory over Russia Sunday night resulted in 12 deaths, 73 injuries and 113 people detained. Russian authorities canceled future outdoor broadcasts of the games in public squares after the rioting. A Scottish man was in critical condition with head injuries after falling from the stands in concrete moat in Jeonju. Another spectator, from Poland, fell from the stands at the same time also was taken to the hospital but was in stable condition.

 percent the year before. The UIL requires its coaches to warn athletes about the dangers of drug abuse, including steroids. The information also will be sent to parents starting with the new school year, Breithaupt said. Any coach encouraging steroid use would be violating UIL ethics rules and could face sanctions, he said. D.W. Rutledge is assistant executive vice president at the Texas High School Coaches Association and has 27 years experience coaching high school and college football. He said his organization hasn't discussed the possibility of testing. "I think most coaches would agree that testing is a real possibility," said Rutledge, who says he never coached an athlete he thought was using steroids. "We'd be sticking our head in the sand if we didn't think there was a problem." One the major concerns over testing is cost. Testing for steroids can be expensive. At the University of Texas men's athletic department, for example, five athletes are randomly tested each week for anabolic steroids each week about \$125 each. During the 2000-2001 school year, the UIL had 750,871 varsity athletes competing. Testing playoff teams would significantly limit expense and still serve as a warning to student athletes, Breithaupt said. The issue will be brought to the legislative council's athletic committee, which could reject the idea, call for a study or recommend testing the full council for a vote. "This will take some development," Breithaupt said.
