Eric Cummings, a senior economics major, said he will always remember last year's attacks and how they affected his life. "September 11 is my birthday and last year I turned 21. I woke up thinking 'Alright, 21!'" Cummings said. But after learning of the attacks on the World Trade Center, he said a birthday celebration did not seem in order. Following the march and a concert by the Aggie Band on Simpson Drill Field, an interfaith prayer service was held in the MSC Flag Room. The service included readings from several religions. Anna Baldassare, junior general studies major, attended the interfaith service because she hoped it would be a good mix of people.

As a New York City native, she remembers the sheer panic she felt when she turned on the television the morning of Sept. 11 last year.

"My mom works for American Airlines, and I remember trying to reach her, trying to reach my family and not knowing what was going on," Baldassare said. "It was really scary and even last night I was concerned."

But Baldassare said Americans need to go on with their lives just knowing we aren't as safe as we thought we were, Baldassare said.

Sajid Sulaiman, a construction management graduate student, said he was not concerned about terrorist attacks on Wednesday.

"We can't just worry about it all the time, we need to think ahead," Sulaiman said. "America is strong, we have taken good precautions."
