American kids escape bloody African uprising

YAMOUSSOUKRO, Ivory Coast (AP) — Waving U.S. flags and shouting "Vive la France!" American schoolchildren escaped a rebel-held Ivory Coast city under siege Wednesday, as U.S. special forces and French troops moved in to rescue Westerners caught in the West African nation's bloodiest uprising.

The evacuation came amid concerns that a full-scale battle could envelop Bouake, a central city of half-million residents. "We're running out of everything," said one frightened Ivorian woman, reached by telephone. "We are scared."

U.S. and French troops moved into Bouake Wednesday to safeguard Westerners caught in a six-day uprising after a failed coup Sept. 19 in which at least 270 people died. With insurgents holed up in Bouake and the northern city of Korhogo, President Laurent Gbagbo has pledged an all-out battle to root out rebels in what was once West Africa's most stable and prosperous country.

The 191 Americans evacuated from the school were escorted by the French military airfield in Yamoussoukro, U.S. C-130 airplanes with them to Ghana Thursday morning, Pentagon officials said.

The children were American flags out of windows as the convoy headed safety down the region's road. "We're very happy to be off campus," one girl said as the convoy swept past. U.S. special forces out of two C-130 cargo planes that touched down in the Coast at mid-afternoon from a staging point in neighboring Ghana. Plane ramps came down and U.S. forces secured the area of the forest-lined Yamoussoukro, clearing way for Humvees that were rolling out.

American soldiers hauled duffel bags and metal boxes idly set up a post at the base for French troops who arrived earlier to move on behalf of Yamoussoukro's signers. American officials would not say what the soldiers were going to do next.

Support within NATO for stand on Iraq is growing

WARSAW, Poland (AP) — U.S. Defense Secretary Donald H. Rumsfeld expressed satisfaction Wednesday with growing behind-the-scenes support within NATO for Washington's tough stand on Iraq, but deep differences remained with some allies on how to deal with Saddam Hussein.

Sparring between Germany and the United States over Iraq prompted NATO Secretary-General George Robertson to warn that hostile forces could profit from divisions among the allies. "There is a huge premium on alliance unity, especially in these dangerous times," Lord Robertson told reporters after the Iraq crisis overshadowed a meeting of NATO defense ministers. "The enemies of the alliance are watching very closely indeed."

Rumsfeld said the United States did not come to the two-day meeting to lobby for support from the allies for military action. He insisted President Bush has made no decision on an attack and is still working through the United Nations to find a solution.

But Rumsfeld said a number of nations offered their backing after he and CIA Deputy Director John McLaughlin briefed NATO defense ministers Tuesday on the gravity of the threat. "I was there... solicited support," Rumsfeld told news conference. "You ask if just happened come in over transom, with being asked and the answer is yes."

Prime Minister Tony Blair, a victorious re-election campaign that angered Washington with its loud opposition to war on Iraq, was unimpressed. "What we read there does not differ from what the German government already knew," government spokesman Uwe-Karsten Heye said Wednesday.

Still, talks between Schroeder and Blair on Tuesday evening were a "helpful" step in the German leader's effort to rebuild trust in Washington, Heye said. He refused to give details on the talks in London. Schroeder's first trip since election Sunday.
