**Uninsured numbers up as employee coverage declines**  
WASHINGTON (AP) — About 1.4 million more people were without health insurance last year as the recession increased unemployment and forced businesses to scale back benefits, Census Bureau figures show. Roughly 41.2 million people, or 14.6 percent of U.S. residents, lacked health coverage for all of 2001, compare with 14.2 percent the previous year, according to bureau estimates being released Monday. The share of the population covered under private, employment-based plans declined from 64 percent to 63 percent last year. "That was the principal cause of the overall decrease," bureau analyst Robert Mills said. Reflecting the broad impact of the recession, rates of uninsured rose across all income levels, as well as among full- and part-time workers and U.S.-born residents and immigrants.

**Ministers gather for final session on monetary policy**  
WASHINGTON (AP) — World financial leaders pledged Sunday to do everything possible to prevent stock market turmoil from derailing an uncertain global recovery and committed themselves to meeting an April deadline for unveiling a dramatic new approach for handling bankrupt nations. IMF Managing Director Horst Koehler said the agreement to move the bankruptcy proposal forward was a major achievement for this year's annual meetings of the 184-nation IMF and its sister lending organization, the World Bank.

**Delegates on Sunday approved a recommendation that the IMF staff develop for consideration by April a fully developed approach for allowing countries with unsustainable debt burdens to essentially declare bankruptcy and force creditors to negotiate more lenient repayment terms.**

**U.N. inspectors meet on details of return to Iraq**  
UNITED NATIONS (AP) — U.N. weapons inspectors, who on Monday will lay down demands to Iraq about getting back into the country, may not get the unfettered access demanded by the United States unless the Security Council alters a deal made in 1998. The inspectors are dusting off old equipment, ordering helicopters and testing new technology as the United States negotiates new proposal for their return.
