cross in Lufkin, said they were inundated with people. "We just got a busload of 600 and he said that 1,400 are following him," she said, referring to a fleet of school buses carrying evacuees from the Beaumont area.

Brown said Lufkin is the first major town that evacuees traveling Highway 69 reach, a voyage that could take seven or more hours on the congested roadway.

The city's civic center has been turned into a medical unit for nursing home patients evacuated from the coast, and area nursing homes have taken additional patients, Brown said.

"It's been so hectic here," said Wendy Walker,

the front desk clerk at the sold-out 39-room Days Inn in Nacogdoches, 15 miles north of Lufkin. "Any time the vacancy sign came on today, I had five or six cars blocking the road so no one else could get in."

Walker said guests have reported no hotel or motel vacancies for a 75-mile radius of Nacogdoches.

"I'm sending them to the shelter, but a lot of people don't want to go there."

In Tyler, East Texas Medical Center (ETMC) sent eight ambulances to Beaumont Tuesday afternoon to evacuate 16 nursing home patients. ETMC Tyler expects up to 30 patients from Beaumont hospitals, and ETMC Rusk expects up to 20 child burn victims from a Galveston hospital.

Other shelters were set up as far away as Nacogdoches, Center and Huntsville.

Louisiana by Thursday afternoon.

Two 24-member teams posing TX-TF1's Flood Rescue Strike Team went on Wednesday afternoon to Houston and Beaumont. The Task Force, administered by A&M's Texas Engineering Extension Service, includes emergency responders from across the state.

If Lili lands in Louisiana task force members may be home Thursday if they are needed, said Marilyn Martell, TEEX spokeswoman.

Louisiana's own state emergency responders would be hand in that case, she said.

"They're just waiting for a landfall," Martell said. "I can't predict what the storm is going to do. But they are in place and ready to serve if needed."

A&M at Galveston is an extension of the main Aggie campus. The on-campus accommodations for the evacuated students are part of the University's existing emergency plan for natural disasters and other events which could threaten Galveston, Stephenson said.
