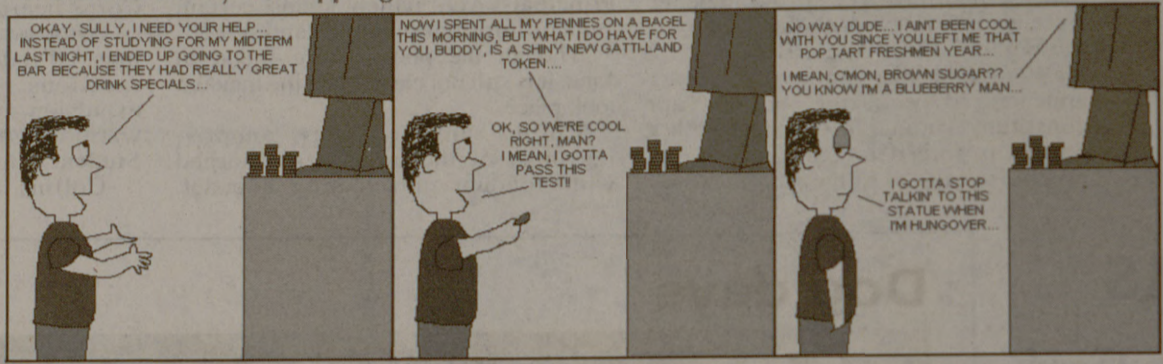

recalled other serial killers who left "calling cards."
 One of the most notorious was David Berkowitz, who killed six people in New York in 1976-77. He wrote a letter to newspaper columnist Jimmy Breslin and left a note addressed to a police detective that said: "I am a monster. I am the 'Son of Sam.'"
 Robert K. Ressler, a former FBI profiler, interviewed Berkowitz after his arrest.

"He said this was a stimulating thing for him to see the letters in the paper," Ressler said. "Even though he's the only one who knows, notoriety becomes very satisfying to an inadequate loser. It's a way of imposing power and control over society."
 Ressler recalled one previous case, in 1970, where a multiple murderer left a tarot card—the slayings of a wealthy ophthalmologist and his family near Santa Cruz, Calif. The killer was captured and sentenced to life in prison.

James Alan Fox, a criminal justice professor at Northeastern University in Boston, said most serial killers don't care about notoriety and get their satisfaction from seeing their victims suffer.
 The Washington-area sniper appears to fit a different pattern, enjoying a cat-and-mouse game with police, Fox said.
 "He's turned the whole region into his personal shooting gallery," Fox said. "He enjoys the sport of hunting for humans. He enjoys his notoriety. He wants us to know. 'That's me.'"

concerning weapon inspections, Iraq agreed to allow inspectors back into the country with "unconditional" access. But Provence said that the Iraqi regime will hide what it can when allowing inspectors in the country.
 "It is just a poker game right now," Provence said.
 He said that inspections can proceed, but Hussein is not suddenly going to become cooperative.
 Stoll said the United States can use the inspections as a way of deporting the presence of Hussein. The United States must move now, he said, because in the future Hussein will act more aggressively and pose a greater threat.

In what may have been a sign of votes to come, the Senate turned back, 88-10, an amendment by Sen. Bob Graham, D-Fla., to expand Bush's authority for pre-emptive military action to include five terror organizations.
 Graham, chairman of the Senate Intelligence Committee, is focusing solely on Iraq could distract from the war on terrorism to "increase the risk at home." But administration allies said it would complicate matters.
 All 10 votes for Graham's proposal came from Democrats, while 39 Democrats joined Republicans in voting to block it.

excluded."
 On the question of satellite imagery, it says inspectors "may wish to resume the use of U-2 or Mirage overflights" under arrangements that existed before inspectors left in December 1998.

The letter also details arrangements for offices, Iraqi escorts, communications, ground transport, security, and visas for arriving staff.
 Under sanctions imposed after Iraq's 1990 invasion of Kuwait, U.N. inspectors must certify that Iraq's weapons of mass destruction have been destroyed. Iraq has banned inspectors from returning for nearly

four years, but agreed late last month to let them come back.
 The United Nations and Britain are seeking a new resolution to toughen inspections and authorize use of military force if Iraq doesn't comply with the inspectors — but France, Russia and China want Iraq to be given a chance to cooperate and oppose any green light now for military action.
