Taylor will miss the first five games serving a suspension for marijuana possession last season. Rice isn't full speed because of his knee, and Kenny Thomas has a fractured thumb.

"I just wish we were healthy," Tomjanovich "I can't get anxious. The good news is these aren't season-long things. I feel good about it when we get healthy and a young kid like Yao has a chance to be with us a while. Then, I'll

have good positive feelings. Shot-blocking forward Eddie Griffin in ready for his second season after an impressive rookie year. He had 134 blocks and was the first rookie to lead the Rockets in blocked shots since Olajuwon in 1984-85.

He was the first rookie in NBA history to average more than one blocked shot (1.84) and one 3-pointer made per game in a season.

"I definitely want to lead the league, that's one of my goals," Griffin said. "Blocked shots are the best moment. when you block somebody's shot, they get down a little bit."

In addition to Yao, the Rockets drafted Bostjan Nachbar of Slovania in the first round.

Tomjanovich's pledge for the season has been to play better defense, and it's been a big emphasis throughout the preseason.

"Coach told us today he thought our defense was ahead of the offense and normally it's the other way around," Francis said. "I think that's (offense) the only thing we need to catch up on. We'll be ready. I know we'll be ready.'


