As a team, the Aggies finished third in the 400 freestyle relay coming in at a time of 3:03.9. The team claimed fourth in the 200 relay.



The Texas A&M volleyball team defeated conference opponent Colorado in five games on Saturday in front of 977 fans at G. Rollie White Coliseum.

Carol Price set a career-high of 23 kills during the match, topping her previous best of 17 she set in the Aggies' last match against Oklahoma.

The Aggies won the first game 30-24 before battling in the second game and falling to CU.

There were 12 ties in the game and seven lead changes before the Buffaloes put the game away, 30-28.

"You can do all the rebuilding and coaching and recruiting that you want, but there's some simple truths in coaching, Steele said. "At some point as a football coach, you've got to win. If you don't win enough, something may happen."
