Stress, culture of military life blamed for Fort Bragg killings
FORT BRAGG, N.C. (AP) — Five killings this summer involving couples at Fort Bragg were probably due to existing marital problems and the stress of separation while soldiers are away on duty, Army investigators said Thursday.
The investigators also said military culture discourages soldiers and their families from seeking help when domestic problems can potentially be resolved.
The conclusions were in the summary of a report from a 19-member team, including mental and physical health workers and military clergy, who visited the base in August and September.

achieved one canine concern, but the pregnancy failed to term, Westhusin said.

The A&M team had produced a clone of a dog because dogs' sporadic mating patterns — and the fact they are only in heat twice a year — made successful implantation and full-blown pregnancy difficult to achieve, Carlson said. A female canine must be in heat to accept an embryo.
"This slows down the process tremendously," he said.
Carlson said the Aggie College of Veterinary Medicine remains the top academic institution in the field of cloning. The University doesn't offer the equipment for dog cloning.

Microfluidics technology uses fluids on a microscopic scale to manipulate embryos, may lead scientists to the right path to achieving a canine clone, Carlson said.
Sperling founded Genesis Savings and Clone after the project received interest from people wanting to clone their own pets.

In December, the Mississippi team produced the world's first cloned cat, dubbed "CC" for "Copycat." The project produced several other significant advancements in the animal cloning field, Carlson said.
But Carlson said the cloning of Missy remains Genesis Savings and Clone's primary goal.

Genetic Savings has a hundred clients with gene bank for their pet cats and dogs, Carlson said. Commercialization of cloned pets would begin the right technology is refined and clone repeatedly and safely.

Westhusin said the College of Veterinary Medicine will focus on livestock and wildlife, and that it has lost funding from an Arizona businessman.

Dr. Duane C. Kraemer, Mississippi project member and A&M veterinary professor, said the College will probably do some stem cell work on dogs and cats which doesn't actually involve producing offspring.
