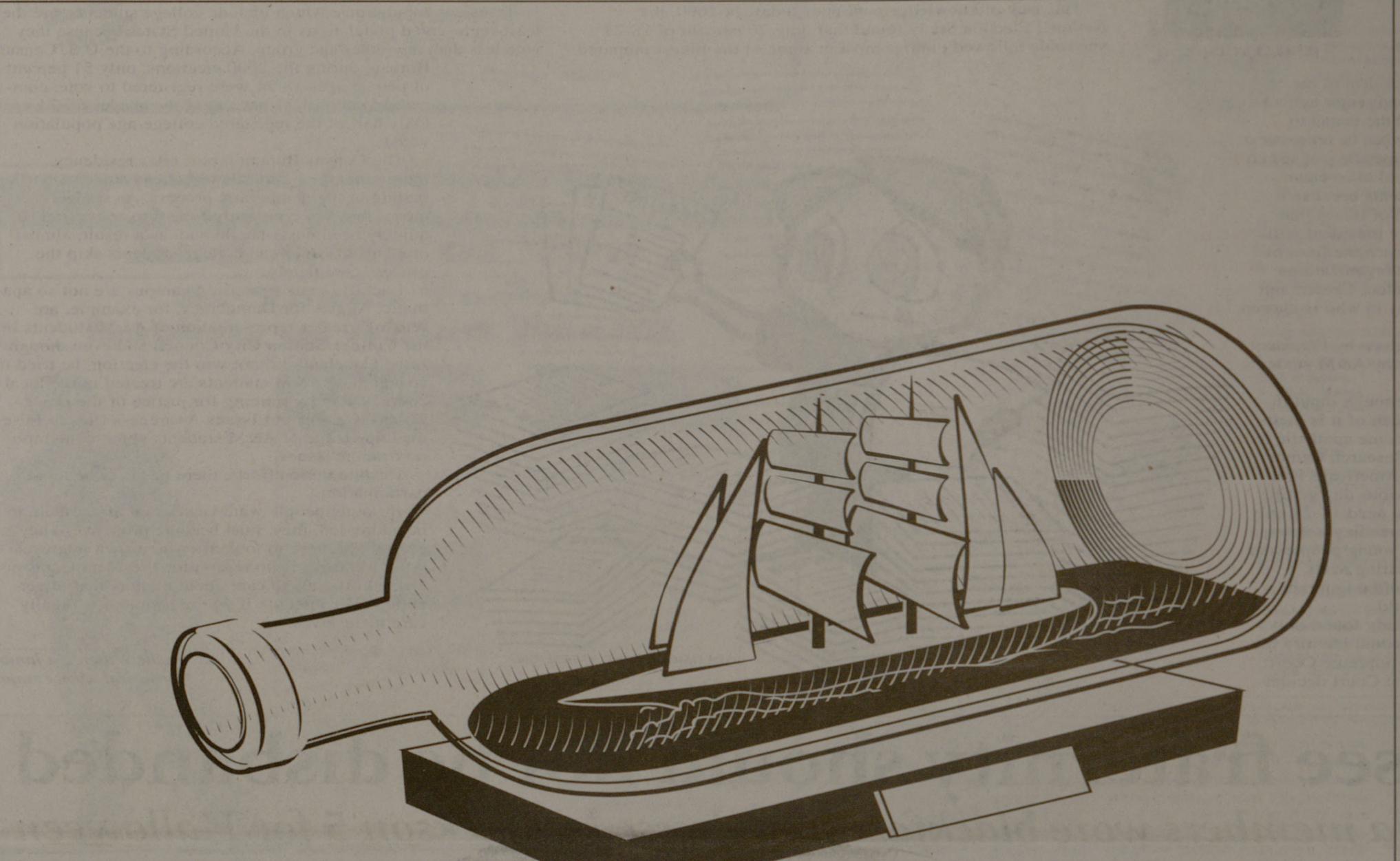

**RFK Jr. plans article  
defending cousin  
Skakel of murder**

NORWALK, Conn. (AP) — The Atlantic Monthly plans to publish an article by Robert F. Kennedy Jr. proclaiming the innocence of his cousin, Michael Skakel, who was convicted in June of the 1975 murder of Martha Moxley. Kennedy's article is expected to be published in the magazine's January/February edition. "We think it's a compelling, important article," said Michael Kelly, editor at large of the publication, adding that Kennedy raises questions about the case. When reached by The Associated Press Monday, Kennedy would not disclose details of what he planned to write. Skakel, a nephew of Robert Kennedy, was convicted in June of beating Martha to death with a golf club in 1975 when they were 15-year-old neighbors in wealthy Greenwich. Skakel, 42, was sentenced to 20 years to life in prison.

**Florida first lady  
devotes her life to  
fighting drug abuse**

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — Florida first lady Columba Bush told high school students Tuesday that she decided to devote her life to fighting drug abuse after learning of her own daughter's addiction. "My heart is broken because my daughter has a problem," Bush told students at the Florida Statewide Drug Prevention Conference in Orlando. "The minute I realized that my daughter faced the same temptations that most of the children face each day, I decided to devote my life to this cause."

**Former Air Force cadet  
says murder was sign  
of devotion to fiancée**

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) — A former Air Force Academy cadet serving a life sentence for killing a teenage girl says he committed the murder to prove his "mate devotion" to his girlfriend. David Graham said he loved Mansfield High School sophomore Adrianne Jones, with whom he had a one-time sexual encounter, to go for a ride with him one night in 1995. He said his then-fiancee, former Naval Academy midshipman Diane Zamora, told him to kill the 16-year-old to prove his loyalty. "There was a point when she (Jones) said something like 'You're not going to kill me, are you David?' or 'Are you going to kill me?' I didn't answer," Graham told Dallas-Fort Worth television station KTVT in a broadcast airing Monday night.

**Prince Charles will  
review theft and rape  
claims against butler**

LONDON (AP) — Prince Charles's private secretary announced Tuesday he will conduct an internal review of questions about the collapse of former butler Paul Burrell's theft trial and allegations of homosexual rape by a former member of Charles' staff. Sir Michael Peat said he would investigate whether any members of Charles' household acted improperly in connection with the unexpected ending of Burrell's trial. Prosecutors dropped their case against the late Princess Diana's former servant when Queen Elizabeth II said he had told her he was holding some of Diana's belongings for safekeeping. Critics claimed the royal family intervened to prevent embarrassing revelations emerging from Burrell's trial. The palace inquiry will also look at allegations that officials covered up accusations of homosexual rape by one of Charles's aides, and the question of royal gifts allegedly being sold for cash, Peat said. An inquiry report is expected to be published by Christmas. "The Prince of Wales has instructed me to undertake this inquiry without fear or favor," he said. "Concerns have been raised in the newspapers. Underlying it may be some matters that may well be of concern to people and therefore we are going to look into these matters."
