AUSTIN (AP) — The cuts coming. And maybe sooner an state agency heads previasly thought.

Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst aid Wednesday that given a edicted \$1.8 billion shortfall the current state budget, offials must start cutting back w. Combined with a a procted \$8.1 billion shortfall for e 2004-05 budget, lawmakers e staring at a potential \$9.9 llion hole.

"We will balance fiscal year 003 and part of that is going to by having reductions in ending by some of the state encies," Dewhurst said withut identifying what agencies ould cut spending and by w much. "In order to balance in '03

e're going to have reductions spending during this year," said.

Dewhurst, who presides er the state Senate, said a letr from himself, Gov. Rick erry and House Speaker Craddick, all Republicans, will oon be sent to state agencies vith that message. He would not discuss


