to disarm through inspections. In Davos, Switzerland on Sunday, Secretary of State Colin Powell said he believed the inspections had run their course, though he did not explicitly call for their end. He said that as a result of Iraq's lack of cooperation, he had lost faith in the ability of inspectors to fulfill their mission. But most of the Security Council believes that's a determination they must jointly make based on the inspectors' assessments.

While there is general agreement that Iraq hasn't been fully honest in its declaration and that it could be cooperating better with weapons inspectors, the absence of a smoking gun or cries for help from Blix and ElBaradei have led powerful council members such as France, Germany and Russia to argue against military intervention and in favor of more time for peaceful disarmament.

While Blix and ElBaradei have made some sharp criticisms of Iraq over the past 60 days, they have also praised the access inspectors were given at hundreds of sites.

is designed to hold storm water for a 24-hour period allowing the water to properly drain into the drainage system without overflowing and causing flooding, he said. The regraded area will not need to hold water for more than a 24-hour period.

This plan still allows for five intramural fields in the area, Godbey said.

Heavy landscaping is being used to cover up the berm along New Main Drive and trees have been planted along New Main Drive, Godbey said.

"Once it starts greening up, it will be quite beautiful," he said.

There was also a need to improve the quality of New Main Drive and Bizzell Loop and the University was able to complete the three projects at once,

Swick said.

"It was less disruptive to the University community if these improvements were accomplished simultaneously," he said.

The section of Ross Street from Bizzell to Ireland Street was also in the plans for reconstruction, but it was impossible to reconstruct all three streets at once, Godbey said. The construction of Ross Street is expected to be completed by the end of 2004.

Construction of a Bonfire Memorial is scheduled to begin in September 2003. The memorial will be to the north side of the Storm Water Management System, Godbey said. The project consists of 12 pillar-like structures designed in a circular form. The pillars will be placed on the directional points of a compass to the hometowns of the 12 Aggies who died in the 1999 Aggie Bonfire Collapse, Godbey said.
