A call to Educational Research Center was not immediately returned.

Both companies created, marketed and distributed the questionnaires to teachers and guidance counselors, asking that they be passed on to students, the FTC said. It said Student Marketing Group paid for creating and distributing the surveys and used the resulting data to create student lists it could sell to companies, the agency said.

In literature sent to the teachers and guidance coun-

selors, the questionnaires said, "Your participation is critical to your students' post-second-ary future," and "This infor-mation will be used by both public and private universities and colleges

The FTC said each survey asked for the student's name, address, sex, birth date, religious affiliations, racial and ethnic background and extracurricular interests.

In October, the National Research Center for College and University Admissions and American Student List agreed to a similar settlement.
