Equestrian team heads to Stillwater

The 2002 Intercollegiate Horse Show Association (IHSA) National Champion Texas A&M Equestrian team will head to Stillwater, Okla. this weekend to take on region rival Oklahoma State in two English riding competitions.

The Aggies aim to pull even with the Cowgirls, who took first place in the California Classic and lead the yearly points race by two points. In mid-January's California Classic held at Fresno State University, the Aggies finished second behind OSU in the western team competition.
