
the Titanic with Dumbo.



Softball season begins with emphasis on perspective

This week has been anything but typical for Stephen F. Austin Head Softball Coach Jennifer Poulsen and her team. At around 8 a.m. Saturday, Poulsen and several trainers were preparing to travel to Houston for the team's opening series with Texas Southern University when they were distracted by a streak of smoke and debris accompanied by a loud boom.

It was not until her team was on the road that Poulsen realized that what she had seen and heard in the Nacogdoches skies was the explosion of the space shuttle Columbia.

Despite an onslaught of media reports of wreckage being found on the team's home campus, the Ladyjacks (2-0) continued to Houston, gaining two wins over Texas Southern before preparing to face Texas A&M on Tuesday. Coach Poulsen spoke optimistically about her team's successful start but said that she and her players did feel personally affected by the day's

tragic events.
