Moment of silence debated Legislator proposes time for prayer

AUSTIN — A bill that would require public schools to hold a minute of silence so students can pray, meditate or reflect came under scrutiny by lawmakers and others Tuesday.

The legislation by Sen. Jeff Wentworth, R-San Antonio, would replace current law that gives school districts the option of holding a moment of silence.

"It is my view at looking at our society over the last four decades, at least, there has been a coarsening of society, I would call it. There is more violence in the schools," Wentworth said.

However, he repeated during a Senate Education Committing hearing that the bill is a not a prayer bill.

"This a reflection, meditation or prayer" bill, he said. "In fact, as I have said before, we won't know if (the students) are doing any of those three things. They may be doing something else because it is actually 60 seconds of silence."

State Sen. Leticia Van de Putte, D-San Antonio, said she was concerned about the bill because school districts now have the option of holding the minute of silence.

But Wentworth said that because the issue has been so

HOUSTON (AP) – Squealing tires, screams and the crash of metal against metal jolted Oscar Torres from his tennis game last summer as he played across the street from a hotel parking lot where a woman is accused of fatally running over her husband with her Mercedes-Benz.




