unrealistic." O'Keefe said he told the panel to "take whatever time you need."

Sen. Olympia Snowe, R-Maine, asked O'Keefe why NASA didn't arrange for a military satellite or a ground telescope to photograph the underside of the shuttle's wing during flight to check for possible file damage. O'Keefe noted the lack of damage in previous incidents in which foam insulaion hit the shuttle.

Sen. John Breaux, D-La., asked how many times heat tiles had come off the shuttle during

"It's no more than half a dozen times," said O'Keefe.

Was age a factor in the accident, Rep. Dana Rohrabacher, R-Calif, asked.

The Columbia was "half the age of the average bomber that flew in Afghanistan a year ago" and the airframe condition of the two is "essentially the same," 0'Keefe replied. Regarding age, he said, "The investigation may prove that was a contributor, but in terms of our efforts to make sure that wasn't a factor, it appears every element of diligence was done."

Sen. Bill Nelson, D-Fla., a former astronaut, said that over he past nine years, "Congress whacked about \$600 million out of the space shuttle" budget and "NASA whacked another \$750 million."






