



### Survivors look for relatives in China quake rubble

BEIJING (AP) - With bloodied hands, survivors du through rubble and called for their missing loved ones after powerful earthquake knocked down homes and schools or Monday in western China offcials said. At least 257 people were killed and more than 1,000 injured.

The quake toppled farmhou es on people eating breakfas and schools collapsed on stu dents in Bachu county, nea China's mountainous border with Kyrgyzstan, officials said

Thousands were left home less and without shelter overnight in 14-degree temper atures. More than 1,000 hom and schools collapsed Bachu, a town of 30,000 peo ple, officials said.

The government put t quake's magnitude at 6.8 while the U.S. Geologia Survey in Golden, Colo., said was a magnitude of 6.3.

## Saddam missed 'final chance,' U.S. seeks U.N. approval for war

UNITED NATIONS (AP) Seeking U.N. approval for wa against Iraq, the United State Britain and Spain submitted resolution to the Securi Council on Monday declaring that Saddam Hussein missed "the final opportuni to disarm peacefully and in cating he must now face the consequences.

But France, Russia a Germany, which oppose military option, circulated a alternative plan to pursue peaceful disarmament of In through strengthened insper tions over at least the next fi months. They won immedia backing from China, despit Secretary of State Colin Powell lobbying efforts with top of cials in Beijing on Monday.

The rival positions set t stage for a heated battle over whether the council wou back the U.S. and Britis demand for war now or the French, Russian, and Germa call for war to be "a last resort

Getting approval for the U.S backed resolution will be daunting task. To pass, the re olution must have nine "ye votes and avoid a veto France, Russia or China. Or Bulgaria is considered a stro bet to support the U.S.-British Spanish plan.
