

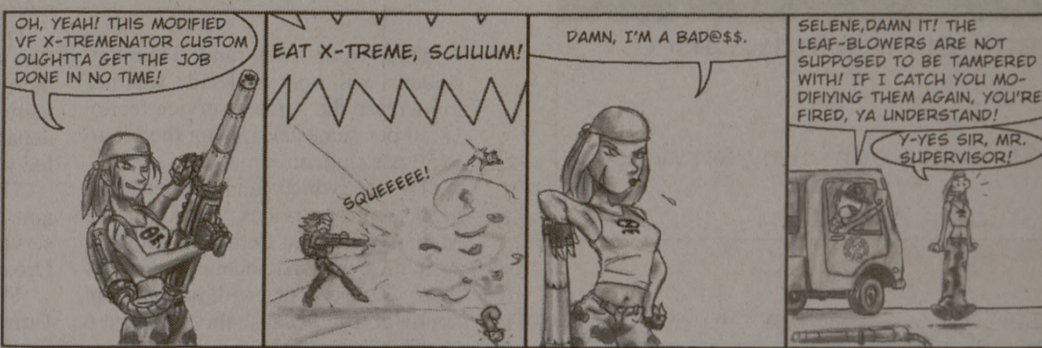

him there in January after giving birth in December to their first child, Hanna Marie.

Mrs. Moor told The Journal-News that she expected her husband to come home around 10 p.m. Friday, but she fell asleep waiting for him and was awakened by a knock on the door after midnight. She opened the door to find a chaplain and a casualty officer who gave her the news.

"They told me that he had passed away," she said. "I was in disbelief. It never occurred to me he would be gone."

The investigation is expected to take one to three months to complete, Harris told The Journal-News. The Criminal Investigation Division has started initial questioning that will continue for about a day or so, then the U.S. Army Safety Court from Fort Rucker, Ala., will begin conducting an on-scene investigation for about two weeks, Harris said.

"We will have a full account

that will take a couple of weeks then we'll issue a full report," he said.

The Journal-News reported Moore was a 1996 graduate of Hamilton High, where he participated in football, wrestling and track. He was named co-Most Valuable Player in wrestling and was named First Team Greater Miami Conference in the 171-pound weight class in 1996, according to the school's yearbook. In addition, he was voted the football team's most efficient running back.

Transit Services. That year, the board recommended a 2 percent fee hike, Oroza said.

The MSC is the largest recipient of student service fee money, collecting about \$2.5 million. Other beneficiaries include Student Counseling Services (\$2.4 million), Student Life (\$1.1 million), Multicultural Services (\$723,000) and the Student Government Association (\$172,000).

raising this fee," said Dana Pierson, president of the Graduate Student Council.

The GSC, after listening to Corrigton make his case for the fee hike last week, passed a resolution urging students to vote down the proposal.

Corrigton said the recreation sports department would need a \$10 fee hike every three years to cover inflation and new initiatives. If students approve the increase this week, the weight room expansion is expected to be complete by 2006, and the Pemberton expansion will be done by 2008.

Student worker wage increases are necessary, Corrigton said, because the department is having difficulty recruiting and keeping students in skilled positions such as medics, aerobics instructors and intramural officials. With about 1,000 student workers, the recreational sports department is the largest student employer on campus.

Students can vote Feb. 26-27 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Memorial Student Center, the Rec Center, Evans Library, West Campus Library, the Blocker Building and the West Campus Library. Students can also vote on the Internet at <http://vote.tamu.edu>.

Corrigton said the new fee increase would generate revenue comparable to the revenue raised by the recreation fee at the University of Texas at Austin. About 70 percent of students use the Rec Center at least once a semester, Corrigton said.
