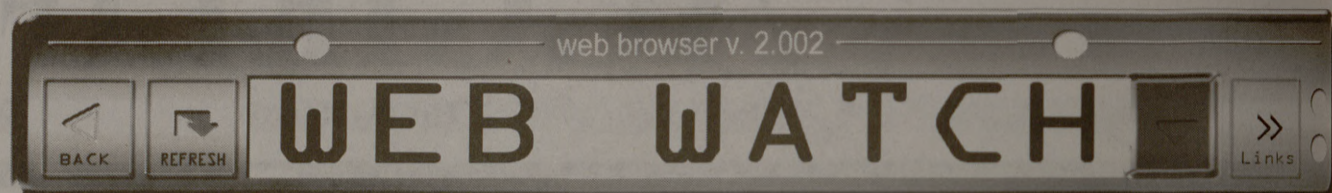

Ever hear that a tooth left in Coca-Cola overnight will dissolve? What about the story of a man setting the cruise control on his car and then crawling into the back seat for a nap? How about the lover's lane story that ends with a hook on the car door handle?

These and other urban legends can be found on the Urban Legends Reference Page (<http://www.snopes.com>). The Web site's goal is to record and prove, or disprove, as many urban legends as possible.

Urban legends are folklore that come in the form of old wives' tales, campfire horror stories and bits of misinformation that have been spread and expanded.

Most urban legends seem to have a grain of truth to them. If one does, the Urban Legend Reference Page will have that truth flushed out in detail.

The Web site is as informative as it is interesting. It puts to rest many rumors and is a great reference tool for obscure facts.

The Web site is easy to navigate, and its legends are organized by category. In addition, the site's search engine can find a story relating to almost any topic imaginable, and features a frequently asked questions page and a message board.

However, once one gets past the first page, the site's layout becomes random. Some pages have music, while others have distracting bright colors.

But the information available on the Urban Legends Reference Page makes the design mistakes forgivable. It's a fun site that should be on everyone's "favorites" list.

Resume writing, job hunting and interviewing can be intimidating, so careerjournal.com provides tips that every potential employee should know.

Careerjournal.com, "The premier career site for executives, managers and professionals," was created by the Wall Street Journal.

At first glance, the Web site looks overwhelming, but Wall Street Journal reporters have dozens of informative stories published on the site that are well worth searching through.

Job hunters can learn what font is used by most professionals and the words that help gravitate resumes to the top of an employer's stack. These, and other similar tips, are published in "How to get Employers to Read your Resume."

First impressions don't get a second chance, and careerjournal.com has articles to help interviewees succeed.

Interview candidates can be informed of the biggest interview turn-off by clicking the link "How Candidates Can Make a Good First Impression." Future employees can also find information about cover letters, job search strategies and nonverbal messages that can sway interviewers.

Some reporters said what employers used to look for in a potential employee's resume and interview isn't what they look for today.

If Web surfers have time to stop for awhile, useful career tips from careerjournal.com can help potential employees from being left behind in the job hunt.

However, the 80s were more than tube socks and Converse sneakers. The online 80s server fills in the blanks left in people's minds about the decade, focusing on TV, music, politics and sports.

Outside of facts about the 80s, the Web site features games, trivia and polls dedicated to the decade. The site even offers visitors a chance to purchase 80s merchandise. The layout is also a step back in time with hot pinks, blues and yellows as the main color scheme.

Unfortunately, that step back is limited by the need for a VIP membership. While much of the site is free to anyone visiting, there are large portions that are password protected. VIP membership to the 80s server is \$39.95 a year or \$3.95 a month. Membership unlocks sections of the Web site and allows users the option to create an e-mail account.

While it's fun to step back in time for a while and remember a decade as eventful as the 80s, it's not worth the membership fee. Much of the site's factoids can be found on free sites if one is willing to do a little research.
