nuclear and chemical plants and in elements of the nation's food supply and distribution system. Ridge said governments are being asked to deploy National Guard troops or state police to help.

At the State Department, Secretary of State Colin Powell said 30 nations had joined the administration's "coalition of the willing," and that another 15 have quietly pledged support.

But at least two of the nations, Spain and the Netherlands, have explicitly ruled out the use of troops to invade Iraq. Another, Japan, was identified as only a post-conflict member of the coalition.

State Department spokesman Richard Boucher said some of the countries "may put troops on the ground" and others may take roles such as assisting in defense against the use of chemical and biological weapons. Intelligence reports indicate that Saddam has given his field commanders the power to use chemical weapons without instruction from the leadership. Pentagon officials said Tuesday.

French President Jacques Chirac, whose country led opposition to war within the UN Security Council, said Bush's action would undermine international efforts at peaceful disarmament.


