A&M cancels Singapore trip

Citing concerns about the outbreak of Sew Acute Respiratory Syndrome in Southeast the University has canceled a study abroad pro gram this summer in Singapore.
Theresa Huth, director of the Internship

Living Abroad Program in the Jordan Institu International Awareness, said the SARS epid which had earlier prompted organizers to pone the trip for a month, made the region risky for the 10 students who were set to spe six weeks in Singapore.

According to the World Health Organization there have been 178 confirmed cases of SARS Singapore, resulting in 16 deaths. The Center Disease Control has issued travel advisors China, Hong Kong, Singapore and Vietnamus Americans planning nonessential travel to the areas to postpone their trips. While in Singapore, students would have stay

with a host family and worked at a profession internship, said Huth, a senior computer eneering major. The students have the option joining a similar study abroad program spi by the Jordan Institute in Australia or they can for Singapore next summer.

The Institute began its Singapore programmity years ago, attracted by the nation's low criment and bustling business climate.
