# Immigrant remains found in railroad car

BAYTOWN, Texas — The remains of three illegal immigrants were found Tuesday in a railroad car after officials were alerted that two of their companions escaped the train.

"The information that (the survivors) relayed to the authorities is the other people that were inside the hopper were incapacitated or were too weak to get out," Harris County Sheriff's Department spokesman Capt. Robert Van Pelt said after the bodies of three men, believed to be Hispanic, were removed from the railcar. "Due to the state of the decomposition, I am unable to tell the race."

The two who managed to flee the Union Pacific train in La Coste, near San Antonio, contacted a priest in Austin who informed the Mexican consulate about the three immigrants left behind.

"They were able to breathe while the train was moving but after some hours, the train stopped and the ventilation stopped also," said Angeles Gomez, spokeswoman for the Mexican consulate in Austin. "When the train stopped, ... they were trying to open the ceiling and then they made a rope from clothing at some point."

Union Pacific spokesman Mark Davis said the immigrants jumped into the hopper car that normally carries plastic pellets or grain Friday near the border-area town of Spofford, Texas, 106 miles west of La Coste. With temperatures outside in recent days around 100 degrees, the two survivors escaped some time Sunday through the manhole-size opening on the top of the car, he said.

Van Pelt said there may have been seven people aboard the train but authorities immediately were uncertain because they had not spoken with the two known survivors.

Bureau of Immigration and Customs

Enforcement spokeswoman Luisa Aquino said the immigration service was working with the Mexican consulate to arrange interviews with the survivors. It is a tragedy, but it is also a very ugly reminder of what can happen and how things can go wrong when you attempt to come into the country illegally, Aquino said.

Tuesday's discovery just east of Houston came three weeks after a stifling truck trailer filled with more than 70 undocumented immigrants was discovered abandoned in Victoria, Texas. Seventeen were dead at the scene and two more died later.

Seven people have been arrested in that smuggling operation. Authorities said they didn't believe the latest victims had been assisted by smugglers.

"This re-emphasizes the nature of what can happen if you trespass and get into a railroad, especially during these times when temperatures are getting hotter," he said.

Union Pacific learned on Monday that there might be dead immigrants in a railcar, Davis said. They found the railcar containing the bodies Tuesday morning at the Union Pacific Coady Rail Yard in Baytown, more than 240 miles east of La Coste, and notified Harris County authorities.

"Put it this way: When you are in an enclosed container with over 100 degrees heat outside, which is magnified inside a steel container, ... it's pretty gruesome what the outcome is," Van Pelt said. "In a case like this, the facts certainly speak for themselves."

"You've got the heat beating down on that railcar, which radiates the heat and intensifies the heat inside. It is extremely dangerous and certainly, it could kill you."

The recent series of deaths may curb illegal immigration but only briefly, said Nelson Reyes, executive director of the Central American Refugee Center in Houston.

"I know that this is not the last time we are going to hear about this," he said.

# Charges filed after child dies in car

LANCASTER, Texas — Two daycare workers were charged Tuesday with injury to a child after the death of a 2-year-old left unattended inside a sun-baked van for more than two hours outside the suburban Dallas daycare, Lancaster police said.

Jimmie Smith, 47, and Onetha Conners, 42, both of Lancaster, face the second-degree felony charges.

"We believe things were not done that should have been done to provide for the safety of the children," Sgt. Joe Hall said at a news conference Tuesday in Lancaster.

"We don't have any reason to believe anyone intentionally left the boy in the van," he said. Workers at the Little Dudes and Daisies Daycare and Learning Center in Lancaster said that Alan Brown Jr. was inadvertently left in the van Friday afternoon after he and 11 other children returned from an outing to a pizza restaurant.

The workers realized Alan was missing about two hours later, after the other children napped, authorities said. Daycare workers found the boy unconscious in the van and emergency help was called. He had been hospitalized in critical

condition at Children's Medical Center in Dallas and died just after midnight Tuesday.

Hall said Smith and Conners are the two daycare workers who went on the trip to the restaurant with the children.

"They returned from a trip and one of the children spent two hours in a locked van," Hall said. "There's some culpability there."

"The temperature was over 100 degrees Friday and he was suffering from heat-related injuries," Hall said. Meanwhile, mourners Tuesday left teddy bears and flowers outside the daycare center, located in a small strip shopping center along with an auto repair shop and a church. A handwritten note saying "We're Closed" was taped to the door of the daycare center.

Injury to a child is punishable by two years to 20 years in prison and a fine.

"We're just hopeful that everyone will take notice with small children or people with disabilities and not leave them in the car," Hall said. When asked what he thought it was like for the boy to be locked in the hot van, Hall was quiet for a moment, then said in a choked voice: "I don't like to think about that. It's tough to have to think about a baby going through something like that."

### Officials investigate fatal ranch shooting

LAREDO, Texas (AP) — Both U.S. and Mexican officials said they were investigating the fatal shooting of an illegal immigrant at the ranch of former diplomat John Hurd.

Juan Garza Mendoza, who said he accidentally shot the 40-year-old migrant Sunday night while hunting, was released from Webb County Jail Tuesday on \$150,000 bond. He had been charged with manslaughter on Monday.

Jesus Barrera Vasquez, of Guanajuato, Mexico, died at the scene from a single rifle shot to the torso. Mendoza, 34, told police Vasquez was apparently crouching

in low brush and that he mistook Vasquez for a wild hog.

Sheriff Juan Garza said interviews with other hunters and with the victim's companions led him to rule out anything but an accidental shooting.

"But then again, Texas criminal law says that when you recklessly discharge a firearm and it kills another person it's a manslaughter charge," Garza said.

He said the investigation was ongoing pending results of an autopsy to be conducted in San Antonio. "The migrants said it was perfectly light, and that they believe the shooter must have been able to see them because they weren't that far away," he said. "A Mexican national has died of a gunshot wound, and someone is responsible."
