Luster. A Star reporter who had covered Luster's trial recognized the 13 pages of handwriting as belonging to Luster.

The great-grandson of cosmetics magnate Max Factor, Luster jumped his \$1 million bail in January, shortly before a Ventura County jury convicted him in absentia of drugging and raping three women in his seaside home in Mussel Shoals, northwest of Los

On Wednesday, Luster, 39, was arrested by Mexican police after he scuffled with bounty hunters in front of a Puerta Vallarta taco stand. On Thursday, the FBI flew him back to California, where he immediately started serving his 124-year prison term.
