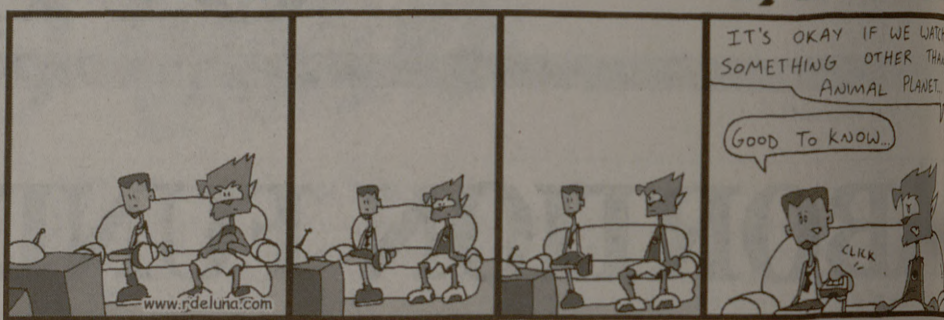

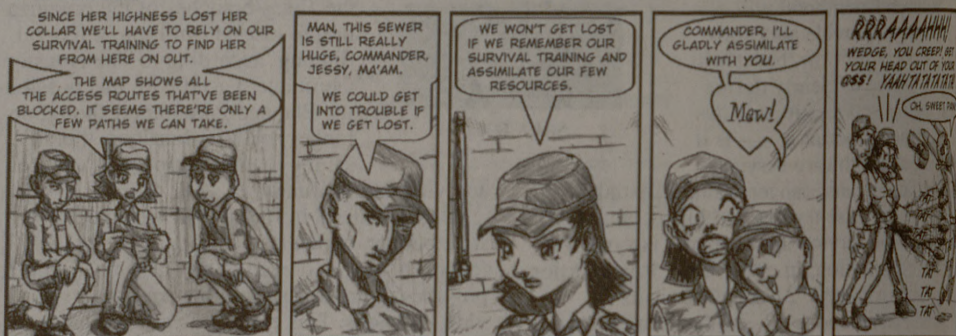

meeting, Ashley said. "I really hope to bring a lot of good information back to the University next week," Ashley said. "I'm hoping after next week I'll have a clearer understanding of exactly what the impact is going to be." Ashley said it was important for students to understand that A&M will not lower its academic standards for admissions. "For some reason or another, a lot of people equate race and affirmative action with lowering standards," Ashley said. "We're not going to lower any bar to try to get more minorities into Texas A&M." Other admissions directors attending include Julie Browning from Rice University, Ray Brown from Texas Christian University and Ron Moss from Southern Methodist University. "There will be some schools from Texas, so hopefully we're

going to ask what the impact will be for Texas," Ashley said. Tom Oliver, director of freshman admission at Texas Christian University, said Brown left for Chicago on Wednesday. "There's a lot of exchange of information that goes on at those meetings," Oliver said. "I'm sure (affirmative action) will be a hot topic of discussion in light of the recent Supreme Court rulings." "We honestly are still in the process of thinking about how the Supreme Court decisions are going to affect us long term," Oliver said. "We haven't made any concrete plans for what we're going to do differently in the future." More than 3,500 colleges are members of The College Board, a national nonprofit membership association, according to the College Board Web site. The Board recently added a forum to its Web site for institutions to share information on ways to attract and enroll racial minorities.

Dotson won't talk unless judge orders

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) — Former teammate of a missing Baylor University basketball player will not talk to police agencies unless he is ordered to by a judge because of how Waco authorities are handling the case, his attorney said Wednesday. Carlton Dotson has been questioned once by a Waco detective who went to Virginia Beach, Va. after Patrick Dennehy's sport utility vehicle was found in a parking lot two weeks ago. Dotson had already returned to his Hurlock, Md., home for the summer. An unidentified informant told Delaware authorities that Dotson told a cousin he shot Dennehy in the head as the two argued while shooting guns near Waco, according to court documents. Dennehy, a 6-foot-10, 230-pound center, has not been heard from since mid-June. Waco police have called Dotson a "person of interest." No charges have been filed in the case.
