

Dean criticizes Bushin front of Texas crowds

SAN ANTONIO — If Howard Dean has anything good to say about the job George W. Bush is doing as president, he's not sharing it with Texans.

The former Vermont governor and Democratic presidential hopeful spent much of Monday lashing the president in his home state, first in Austin and later before a crowd topping 1,000 in San Antonio.

He criticized Bush for starting what he called an ill-advised war in Iraq, for not doing enough to fuel up a sputtering economy, for ignoring the basic health-care needs of millions of people and for enacting a deficit-bloating tax cut that mostly helps the wealthy.

Hussein to persuade Americans "I will never send your brothers and sisters, sons and daugh-

ters to die in a foreign country without telling the American people the truth about why they're going there," said Dean. He also said U.N. troops

should be deployed to Iraq to spread the peacekeeping burden, and that U.S. reservists and National Guard forces should be sent home promptly.

Dean flew to Austin from Spokane, Wash., on the third day his eight-city Sleepless

Summer tour, which wraps up Tuesday.
