

Dyersburg Police Chief Bobby Williamson said there were 12 to 16 people in the basic math classroom when the standoff began. About three hours later, three women students were released, one of whom was three months pregnant. The teacher remained in the classroom.

The gunman, believed to have had a 9 mm pistol and what looked like a butcher knife, made no demands during the standoff. In the evening, he asked for six pepperoni pizzas and two six-packs of soft drinks, which police delivered.
