Gates called the O&M Building "one of the last vestiges of neo-Stalinist architecture," and said if it were up to him, the building would be one of the first to go.

Residence halls Clements Hall and the Fowler-Hughes-Keathley complex, the Pavilion and the Reed McDonald building are designated to be considered for demolition within the next 10 years.

College of Liberal Arts Dean Charles Johnson will also be speaking at the meeting. Leann South, director of college relations, said Johnson will present an overview of the college to senators.

Liberal Arts has recently been grappling with budget cuts due to loss of funding from the state legislature due to a large budget deficit for Texas.

In July, Johnson announced his recommendation for the Department of Journalism to be shut down after allowing current journalism students to complete their degree. According to a 2001 journalism committee report, the department has been in decline for several years and needs to be merged with the Department of Communications. cut, or completely rehabilitated.

After Johnson announced his recommendation, the Former Journalism Students Association and A&M students organized a petition and letterwriting campaign in protest.

Since then, a committee has been set up to seek "alternative pathways" for future A&M students interested in journalism. That report has not yet been finalized and sent to the provost, South said.

Tuesday, Foreign Minister Ana Palacio said Spain will withdraw 25 of the 29member Spanish diplomatic staff from Baghdad. Most will be relocated to Amman, Jordan. Spain has about 1,300 soldiers in Iraq and was one of the strongest supporters of the U.S.-

led invasion.

"We have taken staff out of Baghdad temporarily given that it is a very complicated moment," Palacio said in Berlin. Spaniards working for the U.S.led Coalition Provisional Authority will stay, the Spanish Defense Ministry said without giving their number.

Spain became the third coalition member to withdraw diplomats from Iraq because of


