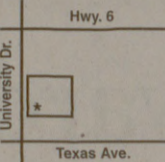

education.
"As our world becomes more globalized, I think it's increasingly important to further educate ourselves on terrorism," Arnold said. "It's an interesting subject that pertains to my major."
Doug Sherman, head of the Department of Geography, said learning about terrorism is important to issues arising now.
"In this era, a knowledge of the roots of terrorism will fit students and help them understand some of the issues currently facing," Sherman said. "It is important that students have a working knowledge of topics such as terrorism and its effect on the world. I think a class gives them that and more."
Prout said terror is a significant influence on all citizens and it will affect the next presidential cycles. Prout said students were addressing a serious issue during the class, which made them more critical of politicians when they talk about terrorism.
Sheffield said her class covered more than just terrorism theory, but current events including Saddam Hussein's weapons of mass destruction. "The class addressed social and cultural issues surrounding terrorism, which, naturally, included current events," Sheffield said.
In the class, Prout has dispelled myths surrounding terrorism. "I work to dispel common myths about terrorism," Prout said. "For example, women are not usually thought of as terrorists when they're involved in something."

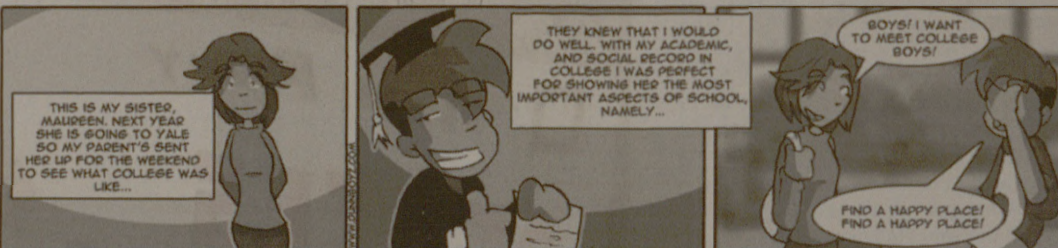

Vargas, A&M Department of Student Life conflict resolution specialist. Vargas had held pre-hearing meetings with each of the students involved.

On the stand, Vargas said the University would go ahead with its punishment procedures, even if the students declined to speak.

Vargas will be cross-examined by University attorneys Monday at 9 a.m. in the 272nd District Courtroom at the Brazos County Courthouse.

Attorneys for both sides expect the trial to continue into late next week.

numbers of troops.

"We are on offensive operations," a U.S. officer said on condition of anonymity. "You can expect to see an increase in the level of intensity and the amount of activity that is occurring, especially in those 'challenging' areas."

"Part of warfare is coercion and affecting the hearts and minds of the enemy and certainly a show of force is a tool that can be used by commander," the official said.

As part of the new tactic, U.S. jets dropped three 500-pound bombs in the Tikrit area and blasted at least three buildings early Saturday after the Black Hawk crashed — apparently due to hostile fire.

Late Saturday, U.S. F-16 jets dropped three 500-pound bombs in the Fallujah area after a series of ambushes wounded three paratroopers from the

82nd Airborne Division, the military said.

In the northern city of Mosul, a senior U.S. commander blamed the attacks on a "mating convenience" between members of the regime, criminals and foreign fighters.

"There are former regime members who want to disrupt the successes achieved here in the north," Maj. Gen. David Petraeus, commander of the 82nd Airborne Division, said. There are also "criminals... who are willing to be guns for hire," as well as "some foreigners who have come in small numbers and have been involved in this as well."

In Baghdad, meanwhile, three mortars exploded late Sunday in Baghdad's Karrada district, damaging a house but causing no injuries, officials said. One officer speculated the target was Technology University a short distance away.

A U.S. patrol came under small arms fire late Sunday in the capital's Kamal Jumblatt Square. There were no casualties and the U.S. patrol drove away immediately without shooting back.
