surroundings.

"When you walk out of the mall you need to be aware of what's going on around you," Kalka said. "This program will help women feel less vulnerable in those situations."

The Rape Crisis Center, which is funded by state and federal grants and local donations, holds the women's safety hotline that is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Trained volunteers go to the hospital or police station when a victim of rape is reported to offer counseling, Yarbrough said.

The volunteers go through a 32-hour training session that provides background on sexual assault and role-playing active training, she said.

"We need more people like Melissa to come forward and help," Yarbrough said. "Hopefully getting the word will help people be aware that we are here for them."

The Brazos Valley Rape Crisis Center is celebrating 10 years of operation, Yarbrough said. They service seven counties including Brazos, Madison, Leon, Burleson, Grimes, Washington and Robertson. For more information go to [www.rapecrisisbv.org](http://www.rapecrisisbv.org).

"It is a once-in-a-lifetime chance to build a strong department that can lead Texas A&M, the state of Texas, the United States and the world into the coming decades," Holditch said.

Holditch received his Bachelor of Science, master's and doctoral degrees, all in petroleum engineering, from A&M. He founded S.A. Holditch & Associates, Inc. in 1977, which became part of Schlumberger Technology Corporation in 1997. Holditch is a Schlumberger Fellow and is a production and reservoir engineering adviser to the top managers within the company.

Holditch has received many awards and recognitions such as being elected to the National Academy of Engineering and the Russian Academy of Natural Sciences and is currently conducting research involving natural gas hydrates, gas reservoirs and carbonate reservoirs.

Hans Juvkam-Wold, interim head for the petroleum engineering department, has known Holditch since 1985 when

Juvkam-Wold first joined the department. Holditch's extensive technical and managerial experience in the industry, as well as his lengthy association with the department, will make him an effective department head.
