A&M in College Station just two weeks earlier.

Sophomore middle blocker Josi Lima and junior outside hitter Lindsey Morris each posted 10 kills for the Jayhawks in the losing effort. Senior outside hitter Abbie Jacobson led KU with seven digs. On the season, the Jayhawks have averaged 15.43 kills, per game to their opponents 13.63.

One match before falling to the Cornhuskers, Kansas won its fourth straight and its 10th conference match, routing Iowa State, 3-0. The victory was particularly significant for Jayhawks' coach Ray Bechard, who became only the fourth coach in Kansas history to reach 100-win plateau.

"Reaching the 100-win milestone is nice, but most important is the 10th conference win," Bechard said. "I just hope the next 100 come a lot quicker."

A win against A&M could spark a strong finish for the Jayhawks. With their final two matchups against Baylor and Texas Tech, they could piece together another winning streak before season's end.

Saturday's match is scheduled for 7 p.m. at the Horejsi Family Athletics Center in Lawrence, Kan.

Anderson's philosophy is that people cannot be approached through one uniform method, but people's differences must be considered beforehand.

"We all start and move along at different points, and we want every student who leaves A&M to be competitive in the global marketplace," Anderson said.

Whether Rocha was speaking from a "corporate standpoint" or Kendall was playing what she called her "race card," each panelist had a different viewpoint about what it will mean to achieve diversity at A&M.

"Speaking from being a white Texan, part of what happens being white, is that we believe in some way the world should stay as is, and we assume we would just run everything," Kendall said. "What has happened, though, is that the rules and world have shifted and those of us in the majority are grappling with what that means."

Kendall said young white men in particular feel like they are not getting what they deserve with diversity or quotas, and they feel disenfranchised, like something has been taken from them.

She feels that working with white students will be important for diversity at A&M regarding what they feel their guarantees are and the confusion felt when they do not get it.

Gutierrez warned that the
