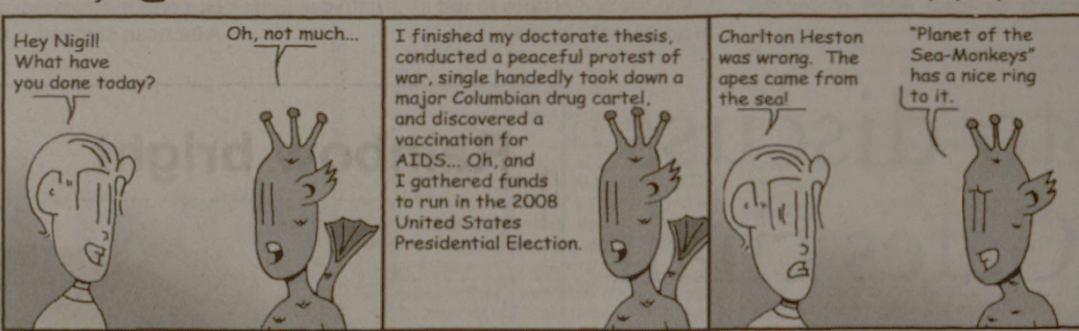

"We will establish no numerical quotas or targets as we seek to increase the diversity of students who enroll," Gates said. "We only know that where we are is unacceptable, and that the future of Texas A&M depends on being more successful in attracting more minority students to join the Aggie family."

Gates said he will ask the Board of Regents, at its meetings Thursday and Friday, to raise the standard for automatic admission from the top half of the Texas high school graduating class to the top quarter.

He said he will also propose that all applicants to the University be required to complete the first two essay questions on the Texas Common Application. Currently, completing any of these essays is optional. Making the questions mandatory will provide more information on each applicant so students can be evaluated on the basis of the whole person, Gates said.

If approved, these changes in admissions requirements will go into

effect in December 2004, or for the 2005 entering class.

Gates also announced the creation of the Texas A&M "Regent Scholarships." Each student admitted to A&M who is a first generation college student and whose family income is \$40,000 or less, will be guaranteed a \$5,000 per year scholarship for four years. Last year, almost 600 freshmen would have been eligible, Gates said.

A&M distributes more than \$250 million each year in financial assistance; about 70 percent of students receive some kind of financial aid.

Gates also introduced the Tuition Policy Advisory Council, which will offer recommendations to the regents regarding tuition increases. The 15-person council will include, in addition to faculty and administrators, seven students, one parent and one former student.

Gates said these changes are necessary to ensure A&M's future success while preserving the traditions and Aggie spirit.

"The changes I am proposing are far less dramatic than those General Rudder made," Gates said, "but they will keep us on the right path."

Millions is that it's like Powerball." Powerball, another multistate lottery game is played in New Mexico.

"But it's closer to home; I usually run over to Santa Teresa to buy one." He anticipated no longer driving to New Mexico to buy Powerball tickets.

The Mega Millions jackpot grew to an estimated \$44 million Wednesday. None of the tickets sold for Tuesday night's \$33 million drawing matched all five lotto numbers and the Mega Ball. That enables Texans to compete in an even greater jackpot Friday.

But Greer is concerned that Texans will be so excited by the new

Javish jackpots that 11-year-old Lotto Texas could suffer.

"For a lot of people, Lotto Texas is the lottery," Greer said.

Initial estimates predicted a 21 percent shift away from Lotto Texas and into Mega Millions. But Greer said he's committed to watching the numbers and maintaining the health of Lotto Texas.

"Mega Millions going to kill (Lotto Texas)," said Don Nettles, publisher of the lottery watchdog website Lotterepost.com. "It's already doing this, going to absolutely kill completely and totally. And it's going to hurt other games."

Nettles said that lottery players in Texas want a "reasonable chance to win" rather than huge jackpots.
